New York Stock Market At Highest Level In 22 Years

NEW YORK, July 27 - (AP) - The stock market advanced last week to the highest point in more than 22 years as measured by the Associated Press average of 60 stocks.

There was a tremendous uncertainty all week but the stock market advanced day after day until the final day.

Then it subsided moderately on profit-taking in the wake of the steel strike settlement.

Wednesday the Associated Press average of 60 stocks established a new high for 1952 at \$107.80. That was the highest point reached by the AP average since June 10, 1930 when the average touched \$110.30.

Thursday a second new high was established with the Associated Press average of 60 stocks at \$108.30, again the highest since June 10, 1930.

The five best gainers of the week with net change and closing price were Alleghany Corp. up 1/4 at 3 1/4, Pennsylvania Railroad up 1/4 at 20 1/4, U.S. Steel up 1/4 at 40 1/4, American Telephone off 1/4 at 153 1/4, and Tri-Continental Corp. up 1/4 at 16 1/4.

Canadian issues closed mixed Friday. Canadian Pacific was up 3/4 and distillers Seagram added 1/4. Hiram Walker slipped 1/2 and Dome Mines lost 1/2. International Nickel and McIntyre were not quoted.

On the curb, Lake Shore fell 1/4. Giant Yellowknife was off 1/4 and Royalite Oil was not quoted.

U.S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND, July 27 - (AP) - The magazine Steel questions today whether the new steel contract will be acceptable in Georgia, Tennessee, Texas and Virginia.

Those states, it says, have statutes of outlawing "compulsory unionism" and together have a basic steel capacity of 1,200,000 tons.

"It remains to be seen whether the union shop provisions will be acceptable in (those) four states," says Steel.

The strike itself, Steel adds, was settled on terms that were substantially the same as those offered by the companies some time before the agreement was reached.

"The modified union shop feature accepted by the companies is an extremely watered-down version compared with what the union originally demanded.

"The whole agreement falls short of the wage stabilization recommendations for which the steelworkers had fought."

Steel figures that the strike cost the average steelworker \$637 in lost wages, cost the economy \$4,000,000,000 in lost sales and wages, and cost steel users 15,300,000 tons in lost ingots.

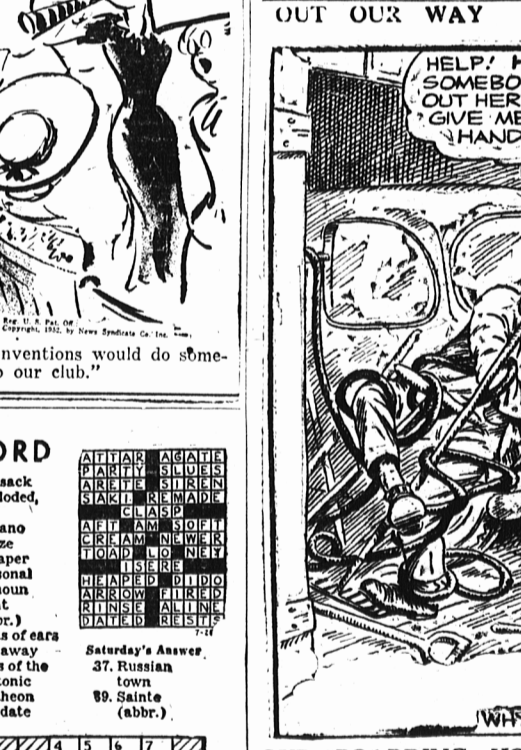
