Her Majesty and Prince Philip will be greeted at H.M.C.S. Queen Charlotte by the Commanding Officer, Lieut-Commander J.N. Keany, CD RCN (R). The Premier of Prince Edward Island will read the Provincial Address of Welcome.

The Premier will then present to Her Majesty and Prince Philip members of the Legislature and their wives, City Councillors and senior service representatives.

The Royal Party will then enter their motor cars and drive to the North Shore where Her Majesty and Prince Philip will honour the Lieutenant Governor

and Mrs. Hyndman with their presence at luncheon.

**FOOD PLANT VISIT**

Enroute to the North Shore the Royal Party will visit the P.E.I. Frozen Food Plant at Sherwood where they will be met by the Provincial Minister of Agriculture, the Hon. Eugene Cullen and Mrs. Cullen. They will also make a brief stop at the farm home of Mr. and Mrs. Willard Frowse.

The Royal Party will leave on return to the City from the North Shore at two p.m. At the Col-

iseum, where children from all parts of the province will have gathered; Her Majesty will be presented with a bouquet by little Miss Velda Paynter of Long River, P.E.I.

Her Majesty will honour three Girl Guides by presenting them with Gold Cords and three Boy Scouts by presenting them with Queen's Scouts Certificates.

**SEE TWO HEATS**

At the Driving Park and Provincial Exhibition Grounds, Her Majesty and Prince Philip will witness two heats of Harness Horse Racing.

They will be welcomed at the Track by the Association President, Cecil Stewart and Mrs. Stewart, the Secretary, Commander G.H. Buntain and Mrs. Buntain, and the General Manager, Mr. H.J. Kennedy and Mrs. Kennedy.

The Royal Party will leave for Government House at 3.35 p.m. and arrive at 4 o'clock. An afternoon tea will be in progress with guests numbering approximately one thousand. The tea will conclude at 5.30 p.m. There will be a short presentation ceremony in which judges of the County and Probate Courts and the M.P.'s for Prince and

Queens County will be present. In the evening there will be private dinner at Government House.

On Friday morning at 9 a.m. the Royal Party will leave the Charlottetown Airport. Following farewells, Her Majesty, Prince Philip will be aboard "Voyage" by the Lieutenant Governor and Mrs. Hyndman, Premier A.W. Matheson and Mrs. Matheson, Mayor Johnstone, Mrs. Johnstone, and the Hon. Angus MacLean and Mrs. MacLean.

**Island To Get 2 Hour Glimpse**

The surgeon and his two assistants, along with several technicians, must keep the operating theatre, x-ray rooms, physiotherapy room and several isolation rooms ship-shape. The same goes for the carpenters, electricians and machinists in their well equipped shops.

The elegant interior of the Britannia makes her a floating palace. The Royal sleeping quarters are situated on the shelter deck the uppermost deck of the main staircase runs down to a vestibule around which are grouped the drawing rooms of Queen Elizabeth, and the Duke of Edinburgh the dining room which can also serve as a theatre and the main drawing and ante-room extend across the full width of the superstructure.

**BUILT IN SCOTLAND**

The Royal quarters include a section for the Prince of Wales—the heir to the Throne—and his sister, Princess Anne. This was, in fact, one of the first sections ever used, as the two children made the maiden voyage of the Britannia to Tobruk, North Africa to meet their parents returning from the Commonwealth tour in 1954.

The Britannia was built at the world famous Scottish shipyards of John Brown and Company located on the Clyde River, birthplace of the world's largest luxury liner, Queen Elizabeth, and was launched in 1953.

A feature of her design is her stability in heavy weather. Denny-Brown stabilizers prevent rolling and stability is also improved by use of aluminum for bridge structure and funnel, which reduces the top-weight of the ship and thus makes for reduced motion in a heavy sea.

**IN EVERY OCEAN**

Part of the deck is specially strengthened to embark and operate a helicopter which can be used for a variety of purposes, including the carrying of despatches to and from the Queen when she is voyaging.

Some small adjustments have recently been made to her superstructure. To enable her to pass under bridges of the St. Lawrence Seaway during the Royal Tour of Canada, the top 20 feet of the mainmast and the wireless gear on the foremast were hinged.

Since her launching April 16th 1953, the Britannia has steamed well in excess of 100,000 miles

during voyages in every ocean of the world. In August of 1956 she made the longest voyage ever undertaken by a Royal Yacht when she journeyed 39,500 miles to a circumnavigation of the globe.

**DUAL ROLE**

On this voyage she travelled around the Cape of Good Hope, Cape Horn and across the Antarctic Circle.

The Britannia was designed to serve a dual purpose—that of the Royal couple on long voyages in peace-time and that of a hospital ship in time of war. She can slide through the water at a steady speed of 21 knots and in test runs has reached as high as 22.7 knots.
