

# Miners, Islanders Renew Feud For Third Place In Game At Forum Tonight

The Charlottetown Islanders meet their arch-rivals the Glace Bay Miners in a battle for third place in the M.M.H.L. at the Charlottetown Forum tonight.

For weeks the Islanders and Miners have been leap-frogging over one another for third place. Seldom has one team or the other remained in third place for more than two days at one time. At the moment the Miners hold down third position, one point above the Islanders.

Coach Bucko Trainor and his Islanders returned home from a three day road trip yesterday evening. During that time they travelled 1,000 miles and since last Saturday have played five games in six nights.

Trainor expects his team to be

in top condition for tonight's game against the fast skating Miners. The Islanders-Miners games with their wide-open style of play have been the best at the Forum this season.

While on the road Trainor used his new forward Claude Robert at centre ice between Paul Saindon and Orin Carver. Of the seven goals the Islanders scored Robert figured in six. He scored four goals and assisted on two.

This is Ladies' Night at the Forum which means that any lady accompanied by an escort will be admitted to the game for fifty cents. Indications point to a good turnout. This is the first time this year that a Ladies' Night has been staged.

# Islanders Getting New Forward This Week-end

Forward Real Charlebois will join the Islanders over the week-end. It was announced here last night by playing coach Wes "Bucko" Trainor.

Charlebois, who is about 23 or 24 years old has seen service in the Quebec League with Sherbrooke Saints. He played with the Saints two years ago and again in the early part of last season until a severe groin injury forced him out of action.

This year he attended the training camp of the Ottawa Senators and appeared to be going fairly well until he was stricken with an attack of appendicitis. At that time he had been ticketed for the Islanders.

He was an outstanding prospect in junior hockey and five years ago was rated one of the best juniors in Ontario.

The Islanders newest addition can play either left or right wing. He stands about five foot, ten and weighs around 180 pounds.

Trainor also announced that he had been in touch with Bill Allum, a former professional defenseman from Ontario. Allum has played in the American Hockey League and in the United States Hockey League.

Allum has been offered the job of managing the rink at Paisley, Ontario and playing with the local team this year. If conditions are right he will remain in Paisley. He is the property of Owen Sound.

Trainor played with Allum in the United States League and stated that the defenseman is a rough-tough performer. Meanwhile Bucko is awaiting word from Tommy Gorman of the Ottawa Senators concerning another defenseman.

# Islanders Ask CAHA To Suspend Mont Joli Club

The Islanders have asked George Dudley of the C. A. H. A. to suspend the Mont Joli Hockey Club of the Lower St. Lawrence Hockey League until satisfactory arrangements have been completed about Gerry LaChance and Bill LeBlanc.

Smith MacFarlane, President of the Islanders Hockey Club wired Dudley yesterday asking for suspension of Mont Joli. He also asked for word about any actions that Dudley would be taking.

At the same time MacFarlane sent a wire to J. T. Beilley, President of the Lower St. Lawrence League. He informed Beilley that the Islanders had asked Dudley to suspend Mont Joli.

The Islanders maintain that Mont Joli owe them a considerable sum of money for the two players who jumped the local club three weeks ago and returned to Mont Joli.

The Islanders bought the players from Mont Joli, paying \$500 for LeBlanc and promising to pay \$300 for LaChance within two weeks.

When the players left the Islanders put a price tag on the players. Mont Joli wired back \$500 but the Islanders demanded more to cover transportation costs and signing expenses.

George Dudley, Secretary of the C.A.H.A. has informed the Islanders they are in the right. He ordered the players suspended but according to word received by the Islanders the two men have been playing with Mont Joli.

# Begin Suits To Annul Marcotte's 1953 Contract

QUEBEC (OP)—Two suits to annul goalie Jacques Marcotte's 1953 playing contract with Quebec Citadelles were taken Thursday in Quebec Superior Court.

The suits were taken by the 18-year-old player's sister, Suzanne Marcotte of Grandmeac, Que., and by Leo Sports Frontenac Inc., owners of Quebec Frontenacs.

Lawyer Mark Drouin said the suits claim Marcotte signed the contract under false representation. It was claimed Marcotte was told he would be enrolled at l'Academie de Quebec, a high school, and would play junior A hockey.

As co-defendants with Citadelles, owned by Frank Byrne of Quebec, the suits named the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association Inc., and the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association and its executive members.

Hewitt, Toronto; J. Harold Brandreth, Calgary; Dr. J. W. Butler, Kelowna, B. C.; Harry Foxton, Portage la Prairie, Man.; J. P. McDougall, Amherst, N. S.; M. L. Gregg, Wingham, Ont.; L. Davis, Iroquois, Ont.; Martin Conway, Verdun, Que.; Gordon Jukes, Melville, Sask.; and E. G. Hedge, Port Arthur, Ont.

Hearings are scheduled to start 12 days after the summons are served.

Mr. Drouin, acting for the Frontenac club of the Quebec Junior Hockey League, said aim of the suit is to break off all ties Citadelles have with Marcotte. It was taken as a result of a CAHA decision last Monday, ordering Marcotte to leave the Frontenac club and report to Citadelles of the Ontario Hockey Association Junior A section.

Marcotte last summer asked the QAHA for his release from Citadelles. He got it and signed with Frontenacs. Citadelles appealed the appeal.

Marcotte said after the decision he still did not want to play with Citadelles, preferring to remain with Frontenacs.

# Halifax Atlantics Score 7-3 Victory Over Miners

HALIFAX, (OP) — The smallest crowd of the season, 1,777, watched Halifax Atlantics defeat Glace Bay Miners 7-3 in a Maritime Major Hockey League game Thursday night.

The win gives the leading Atlantics a five point edge over Sydney Millionaires, who were idle.

Glace Bay used two goalies. Newcomer Cliff Hicks, from the Quebec Senior League started and Dick Dion took over in the second period in a vain attempt to halt the Halifax attack.

Outscoring Glace Bay 3-2 in the first, splitting a pair in the second and firing three unanswered goals in the third, Halifax dominated the play throughout.
