still showed on the sides of their heads. Broods of the year are beginning to gather at Harvey Moore's Sanctuary at Milltown Cross. Wise old quackers... nothing like getting reservations in advance of the opening day.

Ducks have their own troubles. The other afternoon I looked in on a beaver dam and before I reached the site I could hear the alarmed quacking of two mother ducks.

It was a steady volume of harsh quacks that throbbed in the still, mid-afternoon heat and echoed against the wall of green spruces that ringed the pond. I walked hurriedly around the edge opposite the growth of flags and rushes from where the sound originated.

If it was a mink that was causing the trouble I knew my walk would have been in vain but I suspected a hawk or horned owl. Suddenly the top of a dead stub, barely peeping above the flags, detached itself and a Goshawk on rounded wings hurriedly sought the shelter

of the woods. Quiet, as if by magic, settled over the beavers' haven and the hum of insects was again audible. Children of the wild forget their troubles quickly, and live each moment at a time. Why worry over what may be around the next bend or what may come streaking out of the blue without a moment's warning. How often we humans worry ourselves sick over something that never comes to pass.

Blue-wing teal, the species that furnished top sport on opening day last year, have not yet emerged from seclusion in any worth while numbers and it will be late August or early September before any authentic report on teal prospects may be expected. The same goes for the Ring-necked ducks as this species are late nesters and broods are seldom seen before mid-July. Food is abundant at this season of the year and the young ones grow like weeds and are on wing in late September and earlier. Much can happen between now and October 10 but everything looks pretty rosy at the moment in respect to sport afield this fall.
