PARKER HOUSE ROLLS

Makes 3 dozen rolls
Scald 1 c. milk; stir in 1/2 c. granulated sugar and 2 1/2 tps. salt. Cool to lukewarm. Meantime, measure 1/2 c. lukewarm water into large bowl; crumble and add 1 cake Best Yeast—or stir in 1 tsp. granulated sugar and sprinkle with 1 small envelope (or 1 tsp.) Best dry Yeast. Let stand 10 mins., THEN stir well. Stir in lukewarm milk mixture, 1/2 c. lukewarm water, 3 c. sifted all-purpose flour and 1/4 c. melted shortening; beat until smooth and elastic. Work in 3 c. (about) sifted all-purpose flour. Knead on floured board until elastic. Place in greased bowl; grease top. Cover. Let rise in a warm place until doubled—about 1 1/4 hrs. Punch down dough; grease top and again let rise until almost doubled—about 30 mins. Punch down dough again; divide in 3 equal portions. Form each portion into a 12" roll. Cut each roll into 12 equal pieces; form into smooth balls. Roll each ball into an oval 2 1/2" x 3 1/2"; fold in half cross-wise. Place touching each other, on greased cookie sheets. Grease tops. Cover. Let rise until doubled—about 45 mins. Bake in a hot oven, 400°, 12 to 15 mins.
