Virginia-Born Q. E. Manager Admires The Jolly Innkeeper

MONREAL (CP) — Being a desk-bound executive has never appealed to Donald M. Mumford, the man who'll manage the new Queen Elizabeth hotel for the Canadian National Railways in Montreal.

In fact, says Mumford, the hotel business would be improved if more managers got up from their swivel chairs and tried dispensing a little of the old innkeeper's hospitality.

"The traditional jolly host who wasn't above supping with his guests was good business practice you know," said Mr. Mumford in an interview. "It was the life-blood of innkeeping in England. We've come away from it in North America, to our own detriment."

KEEP IN TOUCH

Mr. Mumford gave this as the reason for his own management methods, practised so far in hotels in New York, St. Louis, and Detroit. He rarely spends much time in his office, instead making a point of calling on each staff department of his "hotel community" daily. A good part of the rest of the time he spends talking to guests. At 48 he has had about 30 years of hotel-keeping experience. He's convinced that sound management is far more a matter of human relations than figures on a balance sheet.

Mr. Mumford joined the Queen Elizabeth as a result of the CNR's decision to lease management of the hotel to the internationally-known Hilton chain.

Virginia-born, Mr. Mumford had his first glimpse at the working end of hotel-keeping in 1928, when he joined the old Pennsylvania hotel in New York as a night room clerk while studying at Columbia University by day. Four years later, when 24, he became the Pennsylvania's sales director. He still believes selling a hotel by word of mouth an inseparable part of a manager's job.

In 1941 Mr. Mumford became manager of the Pennsylvania's later moving to two other hotels in the chain—before taking on his present job late in 1956. Hires big staff.

In Montreal Mumford's first task has been recruiting a 1,200-member staff for the CNR's new 1,200-room hotel. He doesn't expect any difficulty rounding them all up, though only "executive types" could be taken on the payroll so far in advance.

The Queen Elizabeth now a cavernous shell rising beside the CNR's Central Station isn't due to open until February, 1958. Nonetheless Mr. Mumford has already signed on two key personnel: An executive housekeeper, who will

manage her own staff of 250, and a sales director. Along with 28 other department heads, they are slated to go to the U.S. soon for training at one of the chain's 25 American establishments.

Charges Gov't With Vote-getting moves

OTTAWA (CP) — Social Credit member C. E. Johnston said Wednesday it would be "despicable" for the government to increase old age pensions and family allowances in an election year when the payments could have been raised one or two years ago.

"Surely there are more honorable ways the government could use to get votes than this underhanded method," the member for Bow River said in the Commons.

Mr. Johnston said a number of Liberal members have spoken urging higher payments. If the government decided to increase them now, the same action could have been taken long ago. That would mean the government had been holding back aid for needy persons in order to gain an election advantage.

1. Double. The hand is much too strong for a simple overcall of one spade. In general, the overcall in the one level denies having a hand which constitutes an opening bid. A one spade bid would be proper if the ace of clubs were, say, the deuce.

The informatory double is made with a hand of at least opening bid proportions and, very often, uncertainty as to the best trump suit. The main function of the informatory double is the representation of strength beyond that which a mere overcall would show.

2. Three spades. This is strictly a pre-emptive bid aimed to change the opponents in their exchange of information. By going two levels beyond the normal opening bid, a long and strong suit with little side strength is represented.

Although the bid is addressed to the opponents and openly acknowledges the fear they have a game, partner is not prohibited from going on to four spades whenever

his hand is big enough. The three spade overcall is usually made with a hand which would also have been opened with three spades had the overcaller been dealer.

3. One notrump. The overcall of one notrump has about the same requirements as the opening one notrump bid. There is usually a double stopper in the suit which is being overcalled. The point count is 16 to 18; the distribution lends itself to notrump play; the high card strength is scattered, though there may be a suit which is not completely guarded.

4. Two hearts. Again there is the strength of high card strength to justify an informatory double, the preferable action is the notrump overcall. The distribution and high card values are more precisely identified by three notrump bid than they would be with an informatory double.

HIGHEST POST OFFICE

TORONTO (CP)—Public Works Minister Winters said Monday the Adelaide Street post office being built in Toronto will be the largest ever erected. The 15-storey building will cost \$14,000,000.

is designed to ferret out everything from sardines to whales, in depths ranging to 500 feet. The portable device notifies the man behind the rod about schools of fish or a single truant.

The instrument also identifies the unsuspecting fish by size and type and indicates the most likely spot to dangle the bait. It works in fresh or salt water and is designed for use aboard pleasure craft and small fishing vessels.

HOW IT WORKS

Technically, the portable fish finder uses a portable indicator scope and a hull-mounted transmitter-receiver unit to give a fisherman a continuous picture of fish activity under the keel. It does it with sound-short, focused, ultrasound impulses transmitted downward through the water. Fish which intercept the sound waves are projected as distinctive "blips" on the indicator scope.

The fish's exact location and depth are projected on the indicator, after lightning-fast electronic computation of the time it takes the transmitted ultrasound wave to strike the fish and bounce back to the transmitter unit.

The indicator unit measures less than a foot square, weighs approximately 26 pounds, and may be obtained handle-equipped to allow users to wander the lengths of the craft and still know the best fishing spots.
