\$75,000 For Saint John Raceway

SAINT JOHN, N. B., May 29 — (CP) — The Raceway Sports Centre at nearby Coldbrook was bought by the Saint John Exhibition Association with a bid of \$75,000 at a public auction Saturday. The only other bidder, F. N. Larkin, Kingsport, offered \$70,000. Council for the Exhibition Association said the organization hoped to re-establish the annual Saint John exhibition at the raceway but definite plans have yet to be made. Meanwhile, events scheduled for the Raceway this summer will be held as scheduled. Its facilities include the home field of the Saint John Dodgers baseball club.

The exhibition has been dormant since 1935. The old main exhibition building at the Barrack Green was destroyed by fire early in the Second World War while being used for accommodation of troops.
