### Drew Reiterates Demand For Trade Conference

#### Both Car Ferries To Operate June 15-Oct. 15

Definite word was received yesterday by Mr. B. Graham Rogers, local Director of Transportation, that both car ferries would operate this year between Borden and Tormentine from June 15 to October 15, which is an extension of one month longer than in former years.

Negotiations have been underway for some time asking for an extension of the time during which both ferries would operate and finally through the efforts of Mr. J. Watson MacNaught, M.P., the extension to October 15 has been arranged.

The extension will be of considerable benefit to the people who transport agricultural and fisheries products as well as to the tourist business. Automobile traffic to and from Prince Edward Island is usually quite heavy during the Thanksgiving holiday period. This anniversary is expected to fall on Monday, Oct. 13.

#### Throne-Speech Debate Ends
