SUMMARY

Montreal: Market mostly higher, trading light.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) - Trading was the heaviest in more than a month as the spring stock market rally Tuesday ran up four straight sessions of advance.

Volume was 10,560,000 shares compared with 9,400,000 Monday and was the largest since March 1—a day of sharp decline — when 11,040,000 shares changed hands.

The Dow Jones industrial average advanced 8.85 to 947.17. American Telephone led the high-quality issues once more on volume, rising 1/4 to 60 on 134,400 shares, making its fourth most active stock.

Investment-grade oils performed better than usual, making some sharp gains. Motors, rails, utilities, nonferrous metals, steels, farm implements and drugs also advanced.

MORE GAINED

Among the 1,437 issues traded, however, gainers outnumbered losers by the wide margin of 794 to 417.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 2.2 to 348.5. Then of the 35 most active stocks rose, four fell and Dynamic Corp. of America was unchanged.

SCM Corp. was the most active stock for the third straight session, rising 1/4 to 65 1/4 on 242,800 shares.

Among Canadian issues a Granby Mining rose 2 1/2, Hudson Bay Mining 2, and Aluminium Ltd. 1/2. Distillers programs fell 1/2, Canadian Pacific 1/4.

NEW YORK (Cont.)

Prices were irregularly higher on the American exchange. Volume was 4,740,000 shares compared with 5,030,000 Monday. Up 1/4 apiece were Molybdenite and Jupiter Corp. while Scurry Rainbow Oil fell 1/4, Canadian Marconi 1/4 and Brazilian Traction 1/4.
