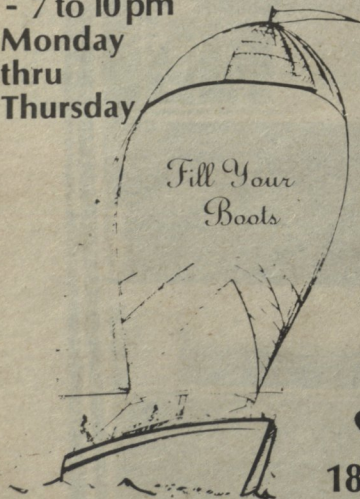

Little response to refundable fee

THE FIVE DOLLAR refundable fee set up by Student Council last semester has posed no problems so far. The fee is a student contribution to the Challenge of the Eighties fund for the restoration of Main Building, Cass, and the rink.

"Only one person has asked for a refund so far", said Betty Johnston, secretary at the Student Union office in the Barn responsible for the refunds. She said in total there have been three inquiries, but no objections at all to the purpose of the fee. "Most student think it's a good idea", says Johnston.

Under an agreement between the Student Union and UPEI Administration, all students pay the \$5 fee along with other SU fees at registration. The fee was made refundable to allow students who objected to the purpose to which it would be used, or who re-

ally needed the money, to get it back.

The refund comes in the form of a five dollar credit to your student account, not in the form of cash. This has put off at least one person seeking a refund.

"Someone came in wanting the \$5 to buy books, but when he found out it wasn't cash, he didn't want to bother", said Johnston.

Partly due to the student contributions, the Challenge of the Eighties campaign reached its goal of 5.2 million dollars in late August. It is proposed that 3 million go towards the renovation of Main building, 1 million towards repair of the Rink, and 1.2 million towards a renovation of the Cass Chemistry building.

Any student who objects to the fund or needs the money can apply for a refund at the Student Union office in the Barn.
