GENERAL TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

LONDON, May 30.—The Daily News publishes a despatch from Cairo stating that in consequence of troubles in the Egyptian district of Syria, the British Mediterranean fleet, now at Alexandria, will sail on Thursday for Beirut. BRISTOL, May 30.—Lewis N. Vallo, road commissioner of Londonderry, met with a shocking accident yesterday morning. Preparations were being made to blast a rock, and Mr. Vallo held in his hand a dynamite cartridge, which exploded in some unexplained way. One of Mr. Vallo's arms and one ear were blown off, one eye was blown from the socket and the other destroyed. A piece was blown through his side and the flesh of his body had the appearance of being mashed to a jelly. He is still alive.
