

Minister Preaches Farewell Sermon

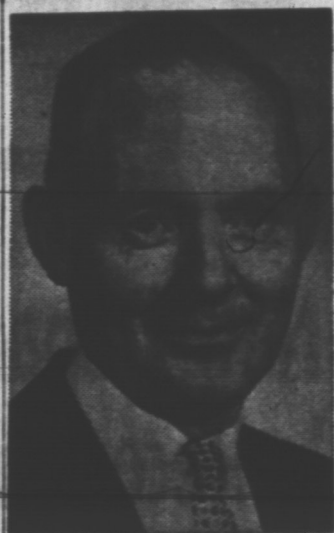
Mr. Hugh Lowry, pastor of the Marshfield, Harrington and Mt. Stewart for over six years, preached his farewell sermon on Sunday to large congregations.

Mr. Lowry was born in Ireland and received his early education there. He accepted an appointment to serve under the General Board of Missions of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, and was appointed to serve in Maritime Presbytery of Bruce and served for 4½ years. For two years he served in Leaskdale, Lindsay Presbytery, following which he went to Winnipeg and served for 4½ years. He came to Marshfield, September 1, 1960.

DURING HIS MINISTRY
During his ministry here many improvements have been made to the property of the three congregations. Attendance has shown a continual increase. Keenly interested in young people a very active programme has been carried out not only amongst the Presbyterians but of all faiths.

He is very interested in the Boy Scout movement and has been the Scoutmaster since the formation of the Troop five years ago. He is District Commissioner for the North Shore district.

Mr. Lowry has accepted the invitation of the Kirk Session of Zion Church, Charlottetown to be assistant to the minister Rev. Dr. D.A. Campbell and will take up his new duties at the beginning of the New Year.

Survey Post To Be Erected

Next year the provincial government will be placing on the provincial administrative grounds a Geodetic control monument and a suitable ceremonial marker to show its location as part of Prince Edward Island's Centennial program, in co-operation with the federal government and all other provinces. A Geodetic monument is a precisely located survey post. Premier Alex Campbell, in making the announcement this morning said that similar monuments with ceremonial markers will be placed on Parliament Hill and at Whitehorse by the federal government and each of the other provinces will erect one on their Legislative grounds.

MARKERS
The 12 Centennial markers and the Geodetic control monuments will be unveiled and dedicated simultaneously at 2:30 p. m. on June 21, 1967.

Premier Campbell noted that of all the Centennial projects planned for 1966, the 12 monuments will be the only co-ordinated national project and the P.E.I. marker will be the only Centennial marker erected by this province.

This Centennial Project is sponsored by and is being co-ordinated by the Canadian Advisory Council on Cadastral Surveys. Council members are Directors of Surveys, Surveyors General and senior Government officials from across Canada, who meet to consider and advise upon matters related to property surveying.

"The monuments will commemorate a new era in Canadian land surveying," and I believe, "will portray the resolve of all the Governments in Canada to progress together in this ancient and specialized profession of land surveying," said the premier.

Children Of Sherwood To Be Heard On CBC

document will be heard on CFCY and CBA. Entitled "The Children of Sherwood", the documentary has been prepared by local freelance broadcaster Jack McAndrew as a special Christmas program for the network series "Between Ourselves" under the production responsibility of CBC Halifax.

The program is being broadcast as a Christmas special because of the strong association of the very appealing and humanitarian nature of the philo-

sophy of giving which underlies the approach used at Sherwood Hospital, and its aptness as a living, working, exemplification of the true nature of the Christmas spirit.

The program will be based on the Christmas pageant recently held at Sherwood, and will include interviews with Dr. Mack Beck, Nurse Consultant Mrs. Ella Wood, social worker Frank Peters, teachers Mrs. Dot Taylor and Mrs. Marie Howatt, Sherwood houseparents Mr. and Mrs. Harold Coffin, Mr.

REPRESENTS ACCUSED
G. Bruce MacDonald, representing the accused, asked that consideration be given the special financial circumstances of the accused. Magistrate MacDonald then set bail at \$1,000 in one surety of \$500 for each of the accused.
