Jury Rules Death Was Accidental

GEORGETOWN — The coroner's inquest last night in the Georgetown Court House, attached no blame in connection with the death of Douglas Earle Elwell, 20, of Gasperaux. The hearing was conducted by Coroner Dr. G.S.A. Inman. Cpl. Douglas Herder, Montague detachment RCMP, conducted the proceedings for the Crown. The deceased came to his death about 8 o'clock on the night of Dec. 5, 1962 at Surgeon room, Edward McAree, Peak due to crushing injuries to the head and body, inflicted by a motor vehicle, which he was driving and which was owned by Donald Joseph Jameson, Gasperaux. The jury further stated that no blame was attached to the owner of the vehicle. The five witnesses called were Lloyd Ross Reid, William Jameson, Donald Joseph Jameson, all of Gasperaux, Capt. Douglas Herder, Montague detachment RCMP, and Kenneth MacPhee, Montague mechanic. Three Fined \$100 Each For Possessing Stills

GEORGETOWN — Three charges under the Excise Act for illegal possession of stills were heard in Kings County magistrate's court, yesterday. All three men charged with the offence, Alfred Roland Moore, Whim Road; Harris Leslie Blackett and Wilfred Milton Blackett, both of Peter Road, pleaded guilty and were each fined \$100 and costs or three months. P.E.I. To Have Wildlife Park

Prince Edward Island will soon have its own and its first wildlife park, it has been learned from an announcement in the Royal Gazette. Work on the park, being established by a private company known as P.E.I. Wildlife Park Inc., is now well underway at Rustico, near the National Park. When completed, the park will hold wildlife, typical of the Maritime Provinces. These will include animals once native to the island but which now have disappeared from the scene: caribou, moose, deer, etc. The park will be operated by Charles O. Bartlett of Sackville, N.S., a Canadian Wildlife Service Officer with the federal department. Other applicants listed in the Royal Gazette are F. A. Stewart Jones, Charlottetown; Joseph P.
