

Features of the Markets.

CHARLOTTETOWN PRICES. OATS.—There is a brisk demand for oats, and quite a quantity are changing hands at 33 cents per bushel. POTATOES.—Potatoes are selling at 20 cents per bushel, there being a very good demand for them at that price. PORK.—There is a very good demand for pork, and the supply is in keeping therewith. The price paid is 7 to 7 1/2 cents per pound.

TORONTO PRICES. Dec. 3.—Flour dull and unchanged; extra offered at \$5, and straight rollers at \$5.15. On the surface the wheat market appears dull, but there is a better enquiry from millers, and it is reported that several of them have been quietly picking up small lots on private terms. In several instances they bid \$1.02 to \$1.03 for No. 2 at outside points, for which holders were asking \$1.05. No. 1 hard seemed to be worth about \$1.20 on the track.

MONTRÉAL PRICES. Dec. 3.—The grain market is still quiet and uninteresting, with little or no business doing. Stocks in store show an increase of 307,000 bushels of wheat, and a decrease of 86,000 bushels of oats compared with the same week a year ago. We quote: Canada spring wheat, \$1.24 to \$1.25; red winter do, \$1.24 to \$1.25; white, \$1.24 to \$1.25; No. 1 (new) hard Manitoba, \$1.28 to \$1.30; No. 2 do, (new) \$1.28 to \$1.30; No. 1 Northern, \$1.28; oats (new), 30c to 38c. There is a weak tone to the flour market, and buyers are holding off. The stock shows an increase of 60,000 barrels compared with the same week last year. We quote:— Patent winter. \$8.50 to \$8.75 Patent spring. 6.50 to 6.75 Straight roller. 5.90 to 6.10 Extra. 5.60 to 5.75 Superfine. 4.90 to 5.25

CHICAGO PRICES. Dec. 3.—There was a decided weakness and considerable excitement in the provision market, and pork broke 27c, closing at \$13.25, December, \$13.35; January, \$13.80. May Lard was also weak and dropped 10 to 22c, closing at \$8, December, \$7.70 January, \$7.87 1/2 May. There was also a weak feeling in the hog market, and prices declined 10 to 15c. The closing quotations were: Light grades, \$5.15 to \$5.40; mixed packing, \$5.10 to \$5.30; heavy shipping, \$5.20 to \$5.40; rough packing, \$5.10 to \$5.20.

LIVERPOOL PRICES. Dec. 3.—In the provision market lard is weaker and declined 3d to 4s, Pork was steady at 82s 6d, and bacon at 45s 6d to 47s 7d.
