**PITTSBURGH (AP)** — Harry Anderson batted in three runs with a homer and single and Ray Semproch pitched an eight hitter Tuesday night to lead Philadelphia to a 4-2 victory over Pittsburgh Pirates. The win hoisted the Phillies into sixth place in the National League, five percentage points ahead of Pittsburgh.

# Norris Sought By Grand Jury

**NEW YORK (AP)** — James D. Norris, chairman of the board of the Madison Square Garden Corporation, is being sought by office of district attorney Frank Hogan for questioning before the grand jury investigating alleged racketeering in boxing.

Hogan said Tuesday that since early June his office has been trying to have Norris appear as a grand jury witness. On June 23, Hogan said, Norris' lawyer submitted a letter signed by a physician certifying that Norris had suffered two heart attacks. Any unusual physical, emotional or mental effort, the letter said,

might have "a deleterious effect upon his health."

The letter has been placed in evidence before the grand jury. "Without reflecting in any way upon the physician," Hogan said, "the grand jury and the district attorney's office feel under no obligation to accept this certification at face value. On the contrary, they are conscious of a duty to have Norris examined by a court-appointed doctor to determine if he is well enough to testify."

Norris resigned as president of the International Boxing Club April 18, 1958, giving poor health as the reason. He has been living in Paris, Ky., much of the time since.

# Beats Handicap To Play His Favorite Game

**OTTAWA (CP)** — Fourteen-year-old Cyril Smith has overcome his one handicap to play the game he loves.

Cyril, born with only a shortened stump for a left arm, is a pitcher in one of Ottawa's newly organized Babe Ruth Leagues for boys 13 and 14. In his first year of organized baseball, he is playing for Manor Park Pirates in the Lansdowne League.

When he delivers a pitch, Cyril holds his glove under the stump of his left arm. Then he quickly brings his glove from under his stump into his right hand and is ready to field a hit.

Cyril, the son of naval Lieut. and Mrs. Warren Smith, is expected to move to Halifax in about two weeks where the navy is transferring his father.

Handling a hockey stick with one hand, Cyril is also a star forward in the Ottawa Public School Hockey League.
