**Nfd. Amends Power Act**

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)—An amendment to the Hamilton Falls Power Corporation Act, designed to ensure that Newfoundland gets eight per cent of the profits before taxes, has been introduced in the legislature here.  
 Mr. Smallwood explained that the British Newfoundland Corporation would give the Newfoundland government eight per cent of both Brinco's and the Newfoundland Power Corporation's profits before taxes.

**Pearson Plans Dinner Series**

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Pearson is starting a series of informal dinners at his official residence for small, select groups of leaders from various walks of life in Canada.  
 The meetings are planned as easy, off-the-record affairs, with conversation flowing informally in the glow of after-dinner conviviality.  
 The first dinner is set for Friday—when 11 publishers, editors and broadcasters will dine with Mr. Pearson. Another group from the newspaper and broadcasting field is to join the prime minister early in June.  
 The gatherings were described by an official in Mr. Pearson's office as an attempt

**to bring about the prime minister and some of Canada's key personalities in the economic and cultural life of the country.**

"There will be no agenda, no points to be made," the official said.  
 Guests will come to Ottawa at their own expense. The cost of the dinners will come out of the prime minister's entertainment allowance.  
 The June meeting, to be attended by the 10 provincial resource ministers and the federal minister, will consider a proposal to launch studies on pollution and on conflicts in the use of resources. It will also be discussed the possibility of another conference on Canada's renewable resources.

**Seal Hunters Hold Meeting**

MONCTON (CP)—Dr. A. W. H. Needler, Canada's deputy fisheries minister, held what he termed a "listening meeting" here with 30 seal hunters from the Atlantic provinces and the Magdalen Islands on the topic of sealing methods.  
 There was no statement issued and officials were not available for comment on the discussion which followed recent complaints about alleged cruelty in the taking of seals.  
 Dr. Needler had said the meeting merely would be to hear the views of the men in the industry on the general field of conservation of the North Atlantic seal herds.

**Draft Review Of Agreements To Be Tabled**

**Hospitals Hear Plan For Special Charges**

OTTAWA (CP)—A proposal placed before the Canadian Hospital Association's annual convention Wednesday suggests that government hospital insurance plans be amended to permit hospitals to charge patients a daily fee of up to \$3 for special services.  
 George McCracken of Toronto, assistant director of the association, said the proposal would provide extra revenue above that received under federal provincial insurance plans, for hospitals that wished to provide special services.  
 The fee would be charged in defined in the proposal, but association officials indicated that they could be whatever new facilities the individual hospital wished to have installed.  
 If, for example, a hospital board wished to purchase a cobalt unit for cancer treatment it could use funds raised by the fee.  
 CHARGE FEE TO PATIENTS  
 The fee would be charged to all patients entering that particular hospital and would amount to anywhere from 50 cents to \$2 or \$3 depending on the special services the hospital wished to finance.  
 The association plans to ask the federal and provincial governments to either accept the proposal for a modification of it or to restate their purpose in the hospital field.
