Kinsmen Sponsor Big Top Show

"Hold yer hosses, — here come the el-funs!"
The stentorian voice of the announcer with a persuasive power all his own, will ring out next Monday morning, when the King Bros. and Cristiani old-fashioned circus parade winds its way through Charlottetown's downtown streets—just as in the days of long ago. All this will be reenacted again show day and literally hundreds will no doubt find themselves wandering toward the circus grounds to live over again those days of years ago.
