Thoughts For Our Time

By His Eminence Cardinal McGuigan (Copyright) Perhaps there is nothing so universally desired today by the people of the world as peace. There have been two world wars within a quarter of a century. These were fought that the people of the world might remain safe from fear of oppression. But even since the last armistice, there has been nothing but unrest and the threat of future struggles. Our hearts and minds are weary of strife, and hunger after the tranquillity which peace will bring. At least two false notions concerning peace are prevalent in a most practical way among people today. And it is no wonder that we achieve nothing but unrest when we consider the nature of these ideas. First, it is commonly held that a lasting peace among nations is achieved solely by the ruler of governments. It is the ruler of diplomat or politician who must bring about the reign of rest and concord into our lives. This notion is only partly true. These men must do their part; but nations are composed of people like you and me. And the majority of the task is left to us to bring about the much desired peace in our times. A country or state is as strong or as good or as peaceful as the individual citizens of which it is composed. It is not the leaders so much who will restore tranquillity to the world; it is the ordinary person. For all of us set the tone of the nation. Especially is this true in our democratic countries, where we are so free to discuss our views and opinions openly. If the majority of the people are seeking peace for the world it will be reflected in the attitude and policies of our leaders. A second and more basic error commonly held, is that peace consists only in a certain tranquillity or order of things external to ourselves. There is peace, so we think, when there is the absence of violent disturbances among peoples or when the strong are no longer using their power to attack and enslave the weak. Peace, according to this view, is a state of society in which nobody bothers us. Each person is free to go his own way undisturbed, to do anything he pleases with the minimum of restrictions. How common, yet how false this notion is. Peace is not simply a negative thing. It is not

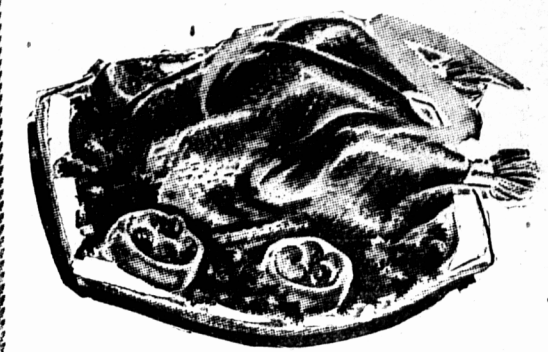
