LETTERS TO THE EDITOR.

Letter From an Old Liberal.

SIR,—No one but a rabid partizan or an inveterate votary of Criticism will venture to gainsay your timely animadversion on the doings of the little oligarchy which rules by a majority of one in this Province. It is well known that the people are beginning to inquire into the real condition of affairs.

Recently the Guardian undertook to start the alarm of threatening embarrassments, and Dr. Jenkins and Mr. D. Ferguson followed suit. Even in the interior the sound of the trumpet is heard to reverberate among the lofty hills of Strathalbyn, in order, I suppose, to arouse "his honor" from Springton from his political lethargy.

The meeting of the "Collective Wisdom" is at hand, but whether the Government will muster courage to propose the "where-with all," is problematical. Mr. Peters and his obedient followers came into power two years ago, with every opportunity given them to redeem their pledges and rectify the grievances of which they so clamorously complained when in opposition. They had the House of Lords at their back, to assist them in their deliberations. Mr. McLeod and his party threw no obstacle in their way, though the balance of power hinged on a single man. It is well known that the so-called Liberal Party are wedded to direct taxation, and would no doubt have been one of their first acts had they not known that the direct tax has become unpopular in the country ever since the extravagant assessment of 1877, passed by the then Liberal Government. They were afraid even to mention it, because of the probability of losing their support in the country. But in order to draw the wool over the people's eyes, they introduced and passed a more iniquitous measure to raise a revenue by borrowing money, or, in other words, issuing debentures, now in the hands of capitalists bearing half yearly interest, knowing that in course of time the country will be called upon to liquidate the principal, wherever the money is to come from. It is well known that the leader of the Grit party (Mr. Davies) had always pronounced against raising money by that method. He was more than once heard to say during the time he was about losing his government on the tax question, that he could carry on the business of the country for an indefinite period without any direct tax, by issuing debentures; but that the sons and grandsons of the present generation would curse the day that such a measure was resorted to.

Matters have now come to a crisis, and a cry is raised that something must be done or else the machinery of Government will come to a standstill. When the members of the present party of purity were in the Opposition they pretended to bewail the deplorable state of the roads, bridges and everything else, and many believe that if they obtained power, the barren hills would be converted into fruitful valleys, that the affairs of Government would be conducted with extraordinary economy, and that the pruning knife would be rigidly and impartially applied all around in order to save us from political bankruptcy. Last session they introduced and passed the amalgamation absurdity, with its obnoxious ramifications, whereby a saving of about \$4,000 was predicted. An impartial observer could not help seeing at a glance that the whole thing was concocted with the view of ousting some of our best and most promising legislators, and securing to themselves unimpeded sway in Parliament. Just imagine Peters, Farquharson, McLean & Co. calling themselves Liberals and wearing the mantle of Coles and Whelan. O tempora! O mores! When in opposition these parrots unceasingly twitted their predecessors for showing so much favor to their friends and supporters, while other poor and capable men were refused employment. It would be something more than amazing to give a detail of grit tactics in this connection. For instance, the people in the vicinity of Rocky Point might ask why it was when the public wharf at that place was being repaired the Government sent for a rich farmer living some twelve miles from the spot, who knew nothing about wharf building, to look after the work at high wages, while poor capable men could be had near the place for one-half the amount? The people of Mile Creek might ask, Why was it when a petition was signed by a large number of respectable supporters of the party and forwarded to His Honor, "our member" recommending a competent supporter to the position of Road Supervisor, it was offered to another, I am told, without asking. The people of the other parts of Lot 65, might ask, Why was it that two J. P.'s were dubbed at Long Creek when there were four J. P.'s already within a few gunshots from these new made squares, while Canoe Cove, and Nine Mile Creek—the largest school districts within the townships—were overlooked.

This is the way our so-called Liberals have treated their best and most deserving friends. They have entirely changed their traditional policy in this and other matters of greater importance to the general public. But I am very much mistaken if these gentlemen will not find out before long that such tactics as they have resorted to since they assumed the Government will not be endorsed by many of their old supporters in this part of the country.

Wells and Pumps.

SIR,—There is nothing about a home that calls our serious attention more than the well out of which the family gets drink. In nice cases out of ten, when the pump is blamed for spoiling the water, it is not the pump but dead rats, toads, mice or such like decaying matter, which is all due to neglect of properly fixing round the curb of the well, and is often the cause of ill-health and no doubt premature death (if long continued) in families that with pure water might enjoy health and energy. Every one should see that his well is properly fixed so that such visitors cannot fall in, and have a good wooden pump when the well is not over 60 feet deep. Experience has proved that a wooden pump is better than iron. It is cheaper, lasts longer, and is much simpler to repair, requiring no skilled mechanic with costly tools to rejoin and fix them. Artesian wells are mostly a failure in this country though they may do well for a few years. In most cases those who got them six, eight and ten years ago, have neither pump or water, while they well and properly walled twice forty years ago is yet as good as ever, and a wooden pump protected from frost will work twenty to thirty years with little expense in repairs.

No one who has a stock of cattle or horses should be without a pump. An open well is unsafe as well as inconvenient; and as often as we hear of well accidents, it is a wonder there is not more considering the state of most of the farmyard wells in this country in winter. There are not many such sights where people pretend to farm in Western Canada or the United States.
