SHAW PROCLAIMS BROTHERHOOD WEEK OBSERVANCE

Premier W. R. Shaw has commended to citizens of the province the observance of Brotherhood Week, being marked this week across Canada.

He said the week is sponsored by the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews, organized in 1947 "to strengthen unity in the nation by bringing together people of all faiths on an understanding and friendly basis for the common good."

The council has adopted a program of student exchange as its main project.

The exchange permits pupils from high schools in various parts of Canada to visit high school students in the province of Quebec or allow French-speaking students to visit with English-speaking students in other provinces. The visits are designed to combine vacationing with an opportunity to encourage bilingualism and better understanding at the school level.

It began in 1956 with an exchange of 350 high school students and has grown steadily till now the Council has set its sights on an exchange involving 5,000 during Centennial Year 1967.

That the program is increasing in effectiveness is shown in the number of exchange students keeping in touch with their host students and spending later vacations together. In several instances French-speaking students moved to the homes of their former hosts for a school term.
