Mutual Friend Moulton Dead.

Francis D. Moulton, who became famous some years ago as Beecher's and Tilton's mutual friend, and who testified against Beecher in the crim. cov. trial, died at New York, Wednesday, of paralysis of the heart. He was 52 years old.

Buddhism Explained.

The latest explanation of Buddhism claims it to be a vast and stupendous scheme of evolution, compared with which the theory of Darwin is but the idle fancy of the school boy. It deals with space so great as to be almost boundless, and with time so long as to be almost eternity; and by it may be solved the problems of the modern evolutionist; by it may be explained the disappearance of the continent over which the Atlantic now rests, and by it the puzzles which the geologist finds in the rocks and stones may be unravelled.

Freed from the Mad House.

Dr. Valee's report has been received and filed in the Supreme Court, of Quebec. He declares that Mrs. Lynam, in his opinion, is sane but that as a matter of precaution she should not return to live with her husband. It is stated that immediate proceedings will be taken by Mrs. Lynam's counsel for a separation from her husband, and also that an action for heavy damages will be instituted against Dr. Howard, the medical superintendent of the Longue Point Asylum.

A Large Ship.

There was launched on the 1st from the shipyard of Jos. Monteith, Maitland, N. S., a fine ship of 1,578 tons register, called the Grande. Her dimensions are: Length of keel 207 feet, breadth of beam 42 feet; depth of hold 24 feet. She is owned by the builders, A. & W. Smith & Co., T. E. Kenny, of Halifax, and Captain James Ellis, late of the ship W. D. Lawrence, who will command her.

Eminent Chemist Dead.

Augustus Voelcker, the eminent chemist and professor of chemistry to the Royal Agricultural Society of England, is dead. He was born at Frankfort-on-the-Main in 1823, educated at the University of Gottingen, and after holding positions in Edinburgh, etc., he became in 1862, Professor of Chemistry to the Royal Agricultural Society of England. Prof. Voelcker has written 'Chemistry of Food,' 'Chemistry of Manures,' 'Lectures on Agricultural Chemistry,' and numerous papers on theoretical and agricultural chemistry in the journals of the R. A. S. of England, the Highland Society, the Chemical Society, etc.

For the Mahdi's Camp.

A Capuchin monk, Father Vincentini, has started for the Mahdi's camp to solicit the release of several monks and nuns. He bears a despatch from the Austrian Consul General at Cairo, addressed to 'His Mighty Highness the Mahdi,' expressing the solicitude of the Emperor of Austria for the release of the captives, and offering to largely reimburse the expenses attendant upon their release. Failing to release the

monks and nuns the Mahdi is requested to give Father Vincentini safe conduct through his lines and to allow other emissaries to go to and fro for the comfort of their captives. The despatch promises that the emissaries will concern themselves neither in politics nor the war.

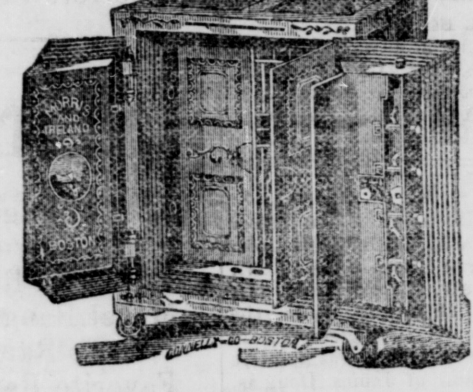
