

Aberton Court Hears 35 Cases

"ALBERTON — A heavy docket of 35 cases was disposed of by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald at Aberton Wednesday afternoon, the greatest number being highway traffic act violations.

"For driving without due care and attention (speeding) Eric W. Wesley Currie, Alma, was fined \$5 and costs or 20 days.

Alfred J. Doucette, Tignish; George Vey, O'Leary; Walter C. Gray, Coleman; Allan Bette, Knutsford; Gordon Morrell, Aberton and Billie W. Getson, Coleman, all received fines of \$15 and costs or seven days for speeding in the village of O'Leary.

"Eric McInnis, Tignish and Howard Joseph Shea, Angio Tignish, were each fined \$50 and costs or 30 days for driving while their licenses were suspended.

Edward Ernest Larier, Aberton, received a fine of \$75 and costs or 15 days for impaired driving, while Raymond A. Ahearn, Aberton, also charged with driving while impaired, had his case adjourned for two weeks.

Interest-Free Student Loans Ready In Fall

Education Minister Dr. George Dewar said yesterday that the new plan of interest-free loans to college students is expected to be operational this fall.

The legislation providing for a new system of loans, he said, "was reviewed at the meeting, and the legislation is now ready to go before the House of Commons."

He was referring to a conference in Ottawa Monday at which delegates from all the provinces were present.

A scheme whereby university students will be able to get interest-free loans to provide for their higher education will be established under this Canada Student Loan Fund, he said.
