MONTREAL (CP)-The U.S. dollar closed at a premium of five per cent in terms of Canadian funds, unchanged from Tuesday's close. Pound sterling closed at \$2.95 9/16, down 1/4.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP)-The stock market rally had enough momentum Wednesday to continue but a vigorous early advance by steels faded into an irregularly lower trend.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks rose 1.00 to 253.70. U.S. Steel was the volume leader. Erasing an early gain around a point it closed with a net loss of 1/4 to 63 1/2 at 80.60 shares.

MONTREAL (CP) - Grade A hogs were 50 cents higher and other prices were steady on the Montreal live stock markets Wednesday. Trading was light and demand fair.

Receipts at 2:30 p.m. were: 47 cattle, 104 calves, 131 hogs and no sheep and lambs. Tuesday receipts were: 273 cattle, 677 calves, 250 hogs and 21 sheep and lambs.

Common heifers were 16-25-17; good cows 18, medium 16-17-25, common 14.75-16 and canners and cutters 9.25-14.50; common bulls 15.50-19.75.

Good weaners were 26-28, medium 20-26 and common 14-18. Grade A hogs were 27.80 and sows 20-21 on the west - end market. Hogs were 27-30, with most at 27 plus 20 cents each.
