

Matheson Has Criticism of Gov't Dept. Shakeup

Little improvement in the method of disbursing funds for industrial development in the province is the view of Liberal Leader A.W. Matheson in the wake of announced changes in Premier Walter B. Shaw in the make up of the P.E.I. Industrial Establishment Corporation. A number of industrialists of the department of Industry and Natural Resources were moved to Agriculture yesterday.

Mr. Matheson said "Mr. MacPhail was the man who did the job. Mr. Myers and Mr. Grindlay voted to produce the vouchers which I asked to have laid on the table of the House at the recent session. Mr. MacPhail voted against the production of the vouchers."

"A number of divisions were transferred to other ministers but the management of the P.E.I. Industrial Establishment Corporation is still left with the same minister. The premier intimated that the appointments made to the board of directors would correct the irregularities discussed under the old board. How can this happen when two new members have been added and there are three members of the former board still in office," asked Mr. Matheson.

NO REAL CHANGES
The Liberal leader said "The real transfer in the department administered by Mr. Rosstter amount to a lot of talk but no changes that will cure the difficulties which were revealed in the 1964 session."

Percy MacInnis, Charlottetown, charged with illegal parking, leaving a motor vehicle on the travelled portion of the highway had his case adjourned by consent to June 8 to enable the accused to obtain counsel.

A Charlottetown youth was given a reprimand for failing to insure a motor vehicle. Facing charges of speeding, Augustine O'scar Richard, Beachgrove, and Lloyd Everett Ferguson, Charlottetown, were each fined \$10 and costs on separate charges of speeding.
