A workshop sponsored by the Prince Edward Island Division of the Canadian Cancer Society was held on Saturday afternoon in the I.O.O.F. Hall, Sydney St., Charlottetown.

This was the first conference of this kind to be held by the local division, and officials of the Society expressed great pleasure at the results of the day's activities.

The purpose of the conference was to provide information about work of the society as a national organization, and more particularly to describe the work being done, and services available for cancer sufferers in this province.

A welcome was extended to those in attendance by F.J. MacDonald, provincial president, and upon registering, each

person received a conference kit from Ethel J. Sutherland, provincial education chairman. Contents of these kits were later discussed in detail by Mrs. Estelle Dennis, executive director of the division.

Dr. W.T. Hooper, director of the division of Cancer Control, spoke on the work of his department, and the many questions asked by the audience, was evidence of the keen interest his talk had engendered.

This vessel of about 6000 tons deadweight is partly refrigerated, has a most modern system of ventilation for all cargo spaces and thus is particularly well fitted for the satisfactory carriage of fresh apples across the North Atlantic.

"Olauknud" will maintain the sailing dates from Boston to Halifax which should have applied to N.V. "Newfoundland", namely Nov. 10 from Boston and Nov. 13 from Halifax due to arrive at Liverpool on Nov. 20.
