Opening lead—four of spades  
Harmon and Stakgold were the most practiced partnership on the United States team. They participated in eight of the nine sessions the Americans played against Italy. Their performance, on the whole, was satisfactory. It was the first time either of them had played in an international match.

In the hand shown (Deal No. 85) they had no trouble reaching four hearts. The two notrump bid by Harmon was a slowdown measure. He did not want to raise hearts directly, which would infer greater strength than he had. When Stakgold bid three notrump, Harmon corrected to four hearts.

Stakgold won the spade lead, played a club to the jack, and

led two more high clubs. West ruffed the third club and dummy overruffed. Eventually, Stakgold made ten tricks for a 420-point score.

At the other table, Forquet and Siniscalco made one of their few blunders when they failed to reach game. This was the bidding:

West North East South  
1♠ Pass 1♠ 1♠  
2♠ Pass 2♠ 2♠  
3♠ Pass 3♠ 3♠

Using the Neapolitan Club system, Forquet's opening club bid (artificial, though in this case he happened to have clubs) showed a minimum of 17 points. The diamond response (also artificial) denied possession of an ace or king. The heart bid was not forcing, but Siniscalco managed to raise to two hearts.

Forquet naturally bid again, showing his club suit, but decided, after long thought, to pass the three heart preference bid by Siniscalco.

The consensus of the experts watching at the time was that Forquet should have gone on to four. Since Siniscalco had not passed one heart, it was difficult to conceive of a hand he might have that would not provide a sound play for game. Some mental reservations were held, however, because Forquet, on previous occasions, had exercised similar judgment and turned out to be right.

The American team gained 4 IMPs.

**Bank Bandits Are Captured**

MONTREAL (CP) — Three bank robbers were captured Thursday after a high-speed chase and a gun battle among north-end Montreal homes.

A policeman was hurt during the pursuit when his pistol went off and wounded him in the leg.

One of the three captured gunmen carried \$3,000 taken earlier from the Banque Provinciale du Canada on Jean Talon Street west.

Five employees and two customers were lined up along a wall at the bank while the armed bandits took \$4,115 from tellers' drawers.

While the holdupmen were still in the bank, one of the girl tellers rang the alarm and the two gunmen fled to their car. Policemen in a passing police cruiser heard the alarm bell and took chase.
