Substantial Tunafish Loaf Is Delicious Luncheon Dish

"A good tuna fish loaf is suitable for the entrée at either dinner or lunch," suggested the Chef. "It is dainty in flavor, yet substantial; can be baked in 45 min. and makes a fine appearance."

"Also it is inside the budget. I think a generous serving comes to less than 20 cents per person."

SERVES SIX
"Three cans of tuna make a loaf to serve six, with some left for luncheon sandwiches."

"I like to serve it with creamed peas or cut asparagus and plenty of well-seasoned rice."

Measurements are level;

Savory Tuna Loaf: In good-sized mixing bowl combine 1 egg, 1 c. undiluted evaporated milk, 2 c. fine soft enriched bread crumbs, 1 1/2 tsp. each salt and savory, and 1-3 c. minced onion. Beat until blended.

Mix in 3 drained (6 1/2 to 7 oz.) cans tuna.

Line 3 1/2" x 7 1/2" loaf pan with aluminum foil. Spoon in tuna mixture.

Bake 45 min. in mod. oven, 350 degrees F.

Let stand 2 to 3 min. Then turn onto platter, foil and all.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK
Apple Walnut Upside-Down Pie: Over bottom of 9" pie-plate spread 1-3 c. brown sugar. Melt 1/4 c. butter and pour over. Stir until mixed.

Add 1/4 c. walnuts cut in 1/4" pieces; press even.

Make 1 recipe American pie pastry or use mix. Divide in slightly uneven halves.

Roll larger half scant 1/4" thick; place gently on top of nuts; do not break pastry.

Trim even with top edge of plate.

Next, peel, core and cut enough apples in 1/2" cubes to make 3 1/2 c. (or use drained sliced canned pie apples). Transfer to pie-plate.

Combine 3/4 c. granulated sugar, 2 tsp. flour, 1/2 tsp. cinnamon, 1/2 tsp. nutmeg and 1/4 tsp. salt. Spread over apple.

Roll out and fit on top crust. Fit even with top of pan. Roll edges of top and bottomcrusts together.

No pastry should be left attached to rim!

Prick top of pie in 5 places with fork.

Bake 15 min. in hot oven, 400 degrees F., then bake 30 min. more at 375 degrees F., or 350 F., if necessary. Watch the walnut butter sugar base because it scorches easily.

Half cool.

Run knife around outside of pie to loosen; immediately turn upside down on large serving-plate. Serve warm, topped with whipped cream.


