Prison Terms For Two French Civil Servants

PARIS (AP) — In a stormy climax to a 2½-month trial, a French military tribunal Sunday sentenced two former high-ranking civil servants to long prison terms for leaking defence secrets to the Communists during the Indochina war.

Books and an empty water glass flew through the air, and fist fights flared.

Roger Labrusse, former head of France's civil defence, got six years and Jean-Rene Turpin, former member of the national defence ministry secretariat-general four years. It was far beyond the demands of the prosecution, which had asked sentences not exceeding 20 months—the time Labrusse and Turpin have already spent in jail.

The tribunal acquitted Jean Moss, former secretary general of the defence ministry, and Andre Baranes, a newspaper man who once worked for the pro-Communist paper Libération.

The verdict itself came after a marathon session of 21 hours. When it was announced, Labrusse grabbed an empty glass and hurled it at Baranes. Labrusse's 17-year-old son threw a book at Baranes' lawyer, Jean Louis Tixier-Vignancourt, a rightist deputy. The lawyer flung two books which missed Labrusse's son but hit a reporter.

Marie Dionne Opens Own Shop

MONTRÉAL (CP) — Marie Dionne, shyest of the four remaining in the blink under the glare of movie cameras as her family priest blessed a flower shop she officially opened Saturday night by cutting a red satin ribbon.

The bespectacled 21-year-old girl has called the shop Salon Emilie after her sister who died in an epileptic seizure in 1954.

Four hours after it was opened to the public more than 500 persons had visited the shop.

Miss Dionne's assistant, Ellen Bourget, said "We had not planned to sell any flowers today but so many people have asked for bouquets to take to patients at the three nearby hospitals that we've had no alternative."

Business originally was scheduled to begin today.

The shop is the first business venture by any of the quints since they came into their \$1,000,000 fortune on their 21st birthday, May 28, 1955. Their financial advisor, L. M. Edwards, said "I have never seen Marie looking so happy."
