Through his father, he is related to Senator Breckenridge of Kentucky, and by marriage, to the Fontaines of New Orleans, his late stepmother having been the daughter of Mrs. Charles Fontaine of that city, and the sister of the Reverend Auguste Fontaine. Mr. Marcel Fontaine, Mr. Narcisse Fontaine and Mrs. Napier Rutledge, nee Clarisse Fontaine. It is expected that a large Southern contingent will be present at the wedding, which will take place at Trinity Church in June, immediately after Mr. Breckenridge's graduation from Harvard.

After taking a wedding trip around the world, the young couple will reside in Milton, as Mr. Breckenridge expects to enter his father-in-law's firm. He retains his interests and his property in Louisiana, but has no immediate plans for returning there for any length of time.
