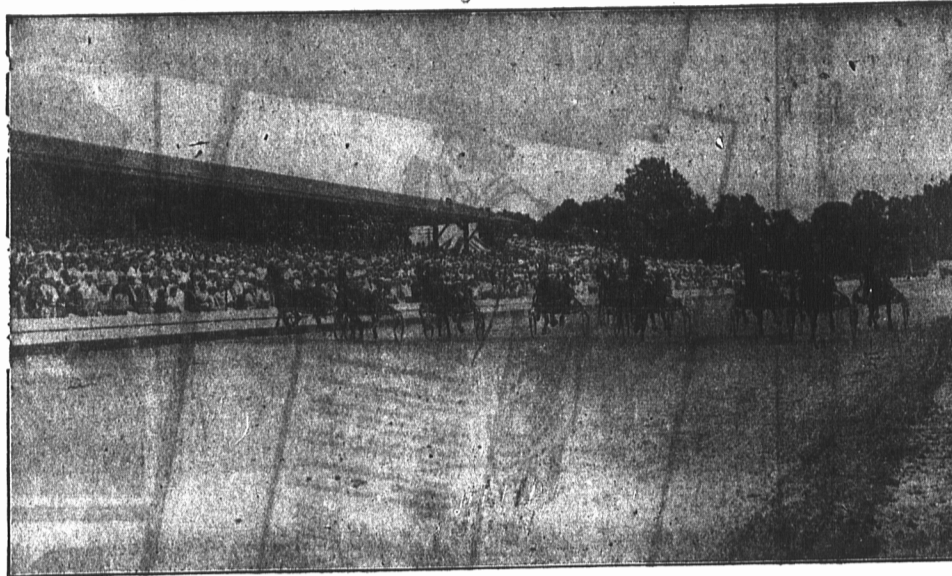


# FAIR WEEK August 14th to 18th

One hundred and sixty entries in the 12 classes to be raced Tuesday, August 15th, Wednesday, August 16th, Thursday, August 17th, Friday, August 18th, means that records since racing commenced September, 1889, have been shattered. In that half century its stretches have echoed to the hoof beats of thousands of gallant steeds. Every year horses from the Maritimes have gathered on the Fair Grounds to test their mettle in exciting races. Never, however, in that long period has there been such a galaxy of speed as is entered for the Golden Jubilee, August 14th to 18th.

While each year this race meet seems to be growing in popularity, yet it was with considerable delight and amazement the management looked over the entry list to find that 113 horses from widely separated

points such as Allston, Mass., Maine and Quebec, as well as through the Maritimes, were coming here.

The one hundred and thirteen horses have made a total of over 160 entries so that figures for all time have been exceeded both in number of horses and number of entries. Not only have local records been broken, but the Maritime record as well. Otto Irvine of Mars Hill, Maine, will act as starter and from the reports received he is the right man for the job.

Race days should be gala days indeed with grand stands packed with people watching exciting finishes and the wonderful vaudeville program of 14 acts.

There is no substitute for an afternoon spent at the Provincial Exhibi-

tion. It will be one that will stand out in memory's pages. Be there—feel again the thrill of close finishes—see the finest trotters and pacers in the Maritimes battling for honors—see also the juvenile trotters and pacers win their spurs—hear the shouts of the drivers as they enter the stretch—hear the cheers of the grand stands as their favorites show in front—don't miss it!
