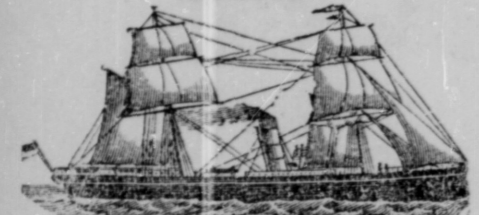

All the personal paragraphs and society news that appear in the London papers is paid for except that which relates to the royal family, the nobility and the diplomatic corps. If an ordinary citizen give a ball or marries off his daughter or entertains the Prince of Wales at dinner, he is compelled to pay for his glory. Mrs. John W. MacKay, Mr. William Waldorf Astor and other ordinary persons, native or foreign, in London society pay for every notice they receive in the newspapers. Sometimes the report of a ball or a wedding costs \$300 or \$400 for every newspaper it appears in. The following standing announcement concerning what is known as the "agony column" will be found in the London papers:

All society personal and fashionable paragraphs, except those relating to royalty and official incidents, will be charged for at a minimum rate of 1 guinea for two lines, each succeeding line ros. 6d. additional.

Therefore, when any of your friends in London send you a copy of an English newspaper containing a personal notice you understand it has been paid for.—Philadelphia Times.

How She Helped Him.

Mme. Sardou, wife of the dramatist, saved her husband's life in his youth and also laid the foundation of his fortunes. While a poor and struggling playwright, he was laid low in his garret by a terrible attack of typhoid fever.
