150 to 185 degrees Fahrenheit. Heat is supplied by hot air forced through a steam coil. Steel racks hold bundles of 50 bags. About 9,000 bags are handled during a 24 hour period. To date something over 75,000 bags have been put through the fumigation chamber. Thermometers are injected through apertures in the wall. Supervising the work is Mr. Frank Calbeck wharfmaster at Summerside. Agricultural officials point out that a number of dangerous potato diseases are transmitted by the use of bags which have been contaminated with infected potato. Potato bags can be disinfected by immersing them in a solution which becomes a cure because when the quantity to be so treated is large. The building which is heavily insulated with two inches of cork has been constructed by the Department of Public Works Canada and is under the supervision of the Department of Agriculture.

The history of the Alberton church dates back to 1831 when the heads of fourteen families organized the first Presbyterian congregation. The first service was held in the home of Mrs. Kele of Malpeque, an outstanding minister of his day.

Fraser, was later to become minister of this congregation. In 1854 the first pastor, John Gordon, father of the Gordons of Erromanga.

MEMORIAL SOCIETY In 1872 a Methodist society was formed on the site where the church building was completed in 1876 or 1877. Prior to 1872 the church was a Methodist mission. The first Methodist minister to be settled here was Rev. J. M. Sproule in 1872.

Mt. Pleasant Man Dies Of Gunshot Wounds

Allison Kenneth Williams, 30, of Mount Pleasant, Summerside, died of gunshot wounds at 1:30 a.m. yesterday in his home at 1085 in the left side which penetrated his chest and lung.

The deceased had been found unconscious on the floor of his home by his wife, who called the family in to see his condition.

A coroner's inquest was convened for the afternoon of this evening at 8 p.m. at the Summerside, and adjourned by George W.E. Callaghan until a later date, when it was decided that no autopsy will be performed.

The deceased was well known in the community and was a member of the road construction company of Williams and Esplanade.

He had returned home late yesterday afternoon from a business trip to the city. It is understood that his wife had left home to visit friends of the family before 8 p.m. and that his three children were in bed when the tragedy occurred.

When the body of the deceased was found by the police, a note was pinned to his chest which read "I was shot by a stray bullet from a gun in the yard."
