Traffic Totals Reveal Decrease

Traffic totals released Saturday by J.D. Davies, manager of CN's Maritime area showed that Canadian National's Northumberland Strait ferry service carried 5145,715 passengers on the Borden-Cape Tormentine run last month. This total represents a drop of 14,303 for the number recorded in August, 1965 and also, 40,000 less than the record set in July 1966.

The four ships in service for the tourist season made 1,120 crossings last month. During August 1965, three ships made 1,256 crossings. The drop in crossings and traffic was a result of the national-rail strike, which resulted in sailings being reduced or cancelled on six days. The Abegweit, Prince Edward Island, Confederation and Scotia II carried 44,443 automobiles to and from the island last month, together with 2,382 trucks, 1,178 tractor trailers, 341 buses, 115 motorcycles, and 4,435 passenger trailers. The total number of vehicles was 52,894 — a drop of 3,922 from August 1965, and 13,042 from July 1966.

Weekly Wages Have Dropped

OTTAWA — Average weekly wages and salaries in Prince Edward Island dropped in April from the preceding month, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reports. The P.E.I. average was \$64.15 compared to \$66.19 in March. But the figure was an improvement over the \$61.11 average of April last year. The P.E.I. average compares with \$79.59 for the entire Atlantic region, \$85.95 for Newfoundland, \$76.16 for Nova Scotia, \$80.91 for New Brunswick, and \$107.20 for British Columbia, which had the highest average of the provinces. The P.E.I. employment index showed an improvement to 111.1 in April, well above the 100.7 index for March and 100.4 for April last year. The 1961 employment index equals 100.
