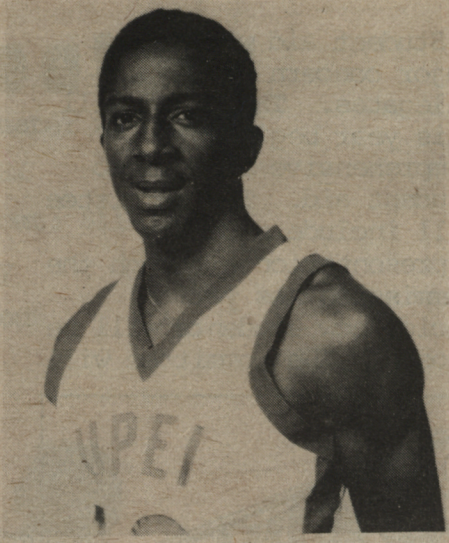


A TOUGH JOB AT UPEI
