The Village Garden.

The dweller in town or city who has a lot large enough to get a team and plow upon it, can generally get some one to plow out his garden and give it a good harrowing. The subsequent work may be done with a garden hoe, and garden rake. If the lot is not large enough for a team or one cannot be procured, the garden plot can be spaded. This should be done to a good depth, not the top skimmed off and turned over. After plowing or spading, give a good dressing of well-fined manure. If no animals are kept or the piece is small, use what poultry manure and wood ashes you have, and if a compost heap has been maintained spread it over the land and rake well in. Do this as early in the spring as possible. When it has warmed up a bit such seeds as peas, beets, lettuce and raddish may be gotten in without much danger of being cut off by frost. Plant in long rows, so you can do much of the work with the wheel hoe, if you desire. It also saves time in planting to run long rows.

At subsequent plantings of the above seeds for succession of crops and of other seeds, as beans and corn the growth of which might be cut off by frosts, more of the ground may be fined and put in shape for planting. Three or four hours at intervals of a week or ten days after the first getting ready will be all the time needed for the planting of a garden that will supply all the vegetables needed by a good sized family.

The first planting, you may get in onion sets, lettuce, beet radish, peas and onion seeds. At the next planting get in the same for a succession, except the onion sets and seeds. Of

peas, lettuce, beets and radish you can plant four or five times, a week or ten days apart. Plant liberally of carrot, parsnip and cabbage and late beets. Do not forget the summer squash, turnips, and beans, both string and shell, including the bush limas.

Squash, cucumbers, turnips and winter raddish may be planted on the same space occupied by the first and second crops of peas after harvesting. The fourth crop of raddish may be planted where the first grew. Cabbage and tomato seed may be planted where the crop is to be raised if you do not care to fuss with a hot bed or the transplanting of plants. Seed is cheap and may be sown where it is to grow and the thinning done with the hoe, leaving the best and strongest plants in the rows.

Have in a little sweet corn, early, medium and late.

You need not put a full row of any one kind of seed in at each or any planting if that would produce too much to be used while it is good. Have the rows long, but have as many kinds of seed in each as you wish. In our garden the past season we had as many as a dozen varieties in some rows, in others we had but one, peas for instance.

Have a good kitchen garden as one of the good things for 1899.—Exchange.

Could a Dog Do This?

The Bloomfield correspondent of the Taylorsville Courier says: Mr. Hal Muir, a prominent dairyman of Bloomfield, has adopted a novel scheme to save manual labor in separating the cream from the milk. He has an improved separator with a capacity of several hundred gallons per hour, to which he was made and attached an inclined tramway. He has a large billy-goat which he has thoroughly trained. At the ringing of a small bell the goat mounts the incline, a rope or strap being attached, one end to the animal and the other end to a ring on

the side of the machine. A lever is then pulled, and the goat starts off at a lively gallop. Mr. Muir then lightes his cob pipe and takes a seat in the big armchair, and the goat does the rest. He has a herd of 40 Jerseys, the finest in the state, and has the reputation of shipping the finest quality of cream that goes to Louisville, for which he receives the one price the year around.

It is scarcely possible to lay too much emphasis on the necessity of intelligent spraying of fruit trees. This has long since passed the experimental stage, and it is a mathematical certainty that the proper application of the various solutions will do much toward increasing the crops of the choice, merchantable fruits. It has been well said that spraying is as essential as fertilizing or draining. Spraying need not cost over 20 to 25 cents per tree, including labor, material, etc., a bagatelle compared with results. Now for an intelligent fight against the canker worm and of her insect pests. Last fall we called attention to the fact that one reason for the short apple crop of 1898 was the earlier neglect in this direction. Let us profit by experience, especially in the coming fruit crop, following the hard winter now closing.—Montreal Witness.

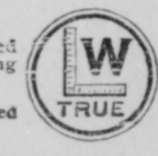
