

# St. Louis Whips Cleveland; Packers Edge Baltimore

St. Louis' Charley Johnson, passing with pinpoint accuracy, threw six touchdown passes, lifting the Cardinals to a 49-13 rout over the defending National Football League champion Cleveland Browns Sunday.

Johnson completed 11 of 19 for 310 yards through the air and the Cardinal defense pitched in with six interceptions. Sonny Randall was the chief target, grabbing three of Johnson's scoring passes. He also hit Willie Crenshaw, Bobby Joe Conrad and Billy Gambrell for scores.

Baltimore Colts, winners in the NFL's Western Division last year, dropped a 20-17 decision to Green Bay Packers with substitute quarterback Zek Bratkowski the Packers' hero. Elsewhere in the NFL, New York Giants edged Philadelphia Eagles 16-14, Dallas Cowboys ripped Washington Redskins 27-7, San Francisco 49ers stopped Pittsburgh Steelers 27-17, Detroit Lions edged Minnesota Vikings 31-29 and Los Angeles Rams ripped Chicago Bears 30-28.
