THE LEGISLATURE. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL DEBATES

Mr. McKENZIE.—If the Bill is going to allow men to vote on mortgage it should be clearly stated, so that there would be no doubt about the validity of the vote.

Hon. Mr. KICKHAM.—In many cases the mortgagee is the chief person interested in the property, for the farmer often fails to pay the interest, and finally leaves the farm; so I think there is nothing unreasonable in allowing a mortgagee a vote.

Mr. SCRIMGEOUR.—I believe in the system referred to by the Leader of the Government of allowing every man one vote where he resides, but it is impracticable to introduce that now.

Hon. Mr. ROGERS.—This amendment proposed by the Leader of the Opposition acknowledges that the mortgagee is the owner of the property, it says "no person shall be entitled, by reason of the ownership, etc."

Mr. CAMPBELL.—I cannot understand the reasoning of the hon. member. We have been governed by a class of men called lawyers who will shortly own this country, and they have given themselves the privilege to make documents to suit themselves.

Hon. Mr. LAIRD.—We know that in other parts of the Dominion the administration has the privilege of appointing returning officers, and I do not see any reason why it should not be the same here.

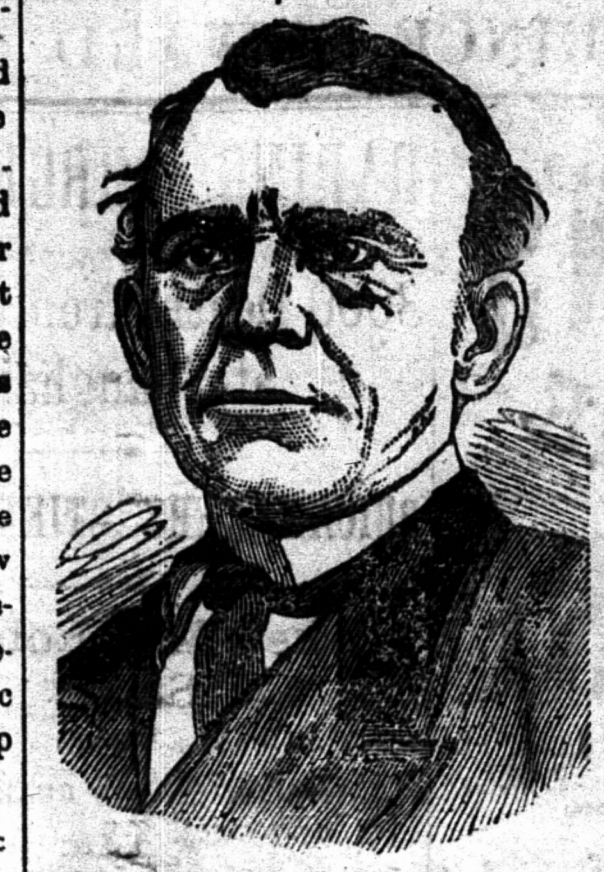

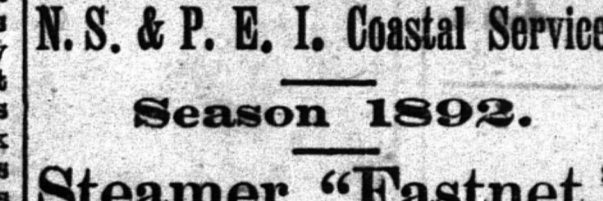
