MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) - Brinco lost some of its steam in a flurry of activity Thursday but held the list as a whole on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges continued its pattern of fractional losses. Brinco finished at 5 1/2 in a turnover of 25,367 shares, with a loss of 1/4 for the day after reaching 6 shortly after the opening. Wednesday the stock moved up half a point in a volume of 31,622 shares. A few of the day's more active issues squeezed out minor gains but prices as a rule were soft. Alcan, with 8,300 shares traded, lost 1/4 at 35 1/2. Rio Alcan and Canadian Breweries edged up 1/4 each at 27 1/2 and 6 1/2. R.A. Oil lost 1/4 at 32 1/2. West Hill Copper supplied a big share of the action among the speculative on the Canadian board, trading 30,850 shares and closing 10 cents higher at 26 cents. High for the day was 82 cents and low 67 cents. Industrial volume was 136,200 shares and mines and oils 1,115,800 shares, compared with 143,300 and 831,700, Wednesday. LOSSES PROMINENT - Elsewhere losses stood out. Mussey-Forsberg was down 3/4 at 3 1/2 and Walker-Goodman also off 1/4 at 28 1/2, low for the year. Haffner-Suffley touched a year's low of 4 1/2 and closed at 4 1/2 for a loss of five cents. Dominion Textile dipped to a low of 29 but finished with a gain at 29 1/2. CPR in transactions of 2,276 shares closed 1/4 lower at 60 1/2. Utilities were mixed. Bell Telephone, volume leader in the section, was up 1/4 at 5 1/2 and R.C. Telephone, more active than in recent sessions, finished at 4 1/2 for a loss of one cent. Trans-Canada Paper lost 1/4 at 3 1/2 and Calgary Power 1/4 at 37 1/2. Banks were lower, the index for the session finishing a low Royal Bank lost 1/4 at 7 1/2.

TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) - Bank issues took the heat of widespread losses throughout the market in light trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange Thursday. Of the five chartered banks, only the Bank of Montreal reached 1966 lows. Royal Bank lost 1/4 to 10 1/2, Bank of Montreal 1/4 to 10 1/2, Bank of Nova Scotia 1/4 to 10 1/2, Toronto-Dominion Bank 1/4 to 10 1/2, and Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce 1/4 to 10 1/2.

In other industrial action, Dominion Bridge dropped 1/4 to a low of 9 1/2. Walker-Goodman fell 1/4 to a low of 3 1/2 and Pennina Pipe 1/4 to a low of 3 1/2. Algonquin Steel fell 1/4 to 3 1/2. Calgary Power 1/4 to 37 1/2 and R.A. Oil 1/4 to 32 1/2. In senior base metals, Inco and Falconbridge both closed at 97, off 1/4 each. Noranda dropped 1/4 to 54 1/2. Uranium in good shape - Uranium issues were higher, with Denison up 1/4 and Roman Corp., holder of a block of Denison shares, ahead 1/4 to 16 1/2. Preston Mines gained 1/4 to 16 1/2. Preston holds a block of Rio Algonquin shares; Rio Algonquin was unchanged at 27 1/2. In golds, Campbell Lake lost 1/4 to 52 and Dome 1/4 to 52. McIntyre Porcupine gained 1/4 to 10 1/2. In senior western oils, Suncor Rainbow lost 1/4 to 30 1/2 and Union 1/4 to 31 1/2. Superior dropped 1/4 to 19 1/2 and Banff 1/4 to 14 1/2. Silver-gold dominated penny mining trading, gaining 1/4 cents to 50 cents on 240,425 shares. Mt. Wright rose 1/4 cent to 35 cents on 123,500 shares. Provo led speculative action, gaining 10 cents to \$2.66 on 43,316 shares. On index, industrials lost 5/8 to 160.40, golds 1/4 to 160.53, western oils 1/4 to 162.40, and the exchange index 66 to 152.70. Base metals rose 3/8 to 98.55. Volume at the close of trading was 2,622,000 shares, compared with 2,395,000 shares traded Wednesday.

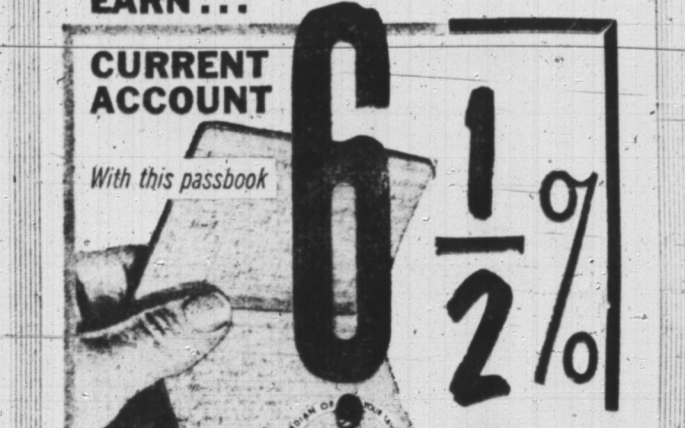

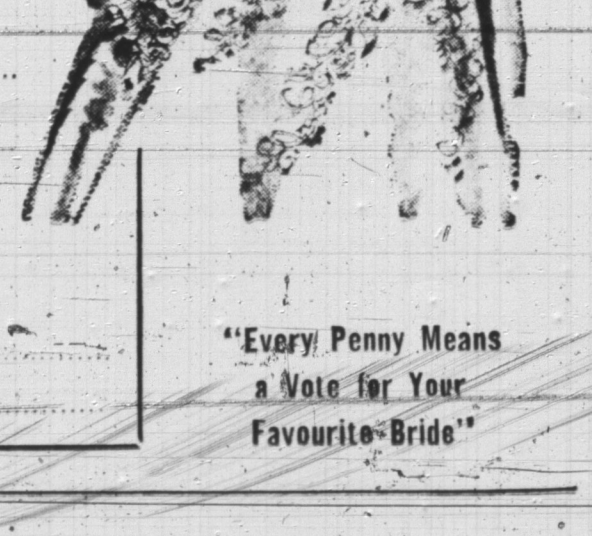
