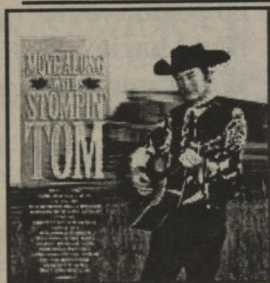

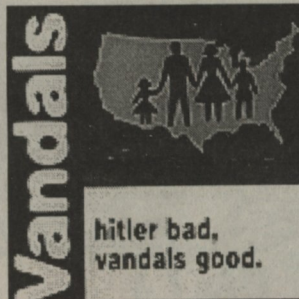
There is something

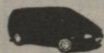
