

CURRENT NOTES.

W. Walker & Co., shipbuilders London have failed for £67,000.

The Marquis of Lorne has been elected Commodore of the Royal Nova Scotian Yacht Squadron.

Gambetta once said to the Prince of Wales, "Ah, sir, if all Princes were like your Royal Highness there would be no republics."

Buchanan Hepburn, a British nobleman, was murdered by miners, on Sunday, in Pinos Altos, Chihuahua, Mexico. Five of the murderers were tried and shot on Monday last.

The Czar in his manifesto giving notice of his approaching coronation, says:—"We determined in our heart not to perform this sacred rite until the feelings excited by the crime to which the benefactor of the people fell a victim, had time to calm.

Mr. Davitt, in an interview on the 7th, said to give bail for good behaviour toward landlords was impossible. He predicted the overthrow of the land monopoly. The growing importance of the Irish party in Parliament, he said, was being recognized.

Mr. Healy, M. P., presiding at the first public meeting of the National Land League in Dublin, on the 7th inst. referred to his impending imprisonment and reiterated his intention of pursuing the same course which has hitherto marked his political life.

The most aged English baronet is the venerable Sir Moses Montefiore, who, on the 25th of October next, will enter upon his hundredth year. According to the list compiled by the editor of "Webster's Red Book," Sir Henry Prouse, a Scotch baronet born in the year 1783, still survives. There are at least twenty barones living who were born before the commencement of the present century. The oldest of these, after the names already mentioned, appears to be Sir T. Tyringham Bernard, born in 1791.

A new use of glass is reported, viz: for shingles. It is claimed that glass roofing is at once better, more durable and cheaper than slate. The glass is usually opaque, but may be translucent or clear as desired, in which latter case an effect might be produced, almost as brilliant as the Ice Palace in Montreal. The exposed parts of the shingles are corrugated, says the Brick and Tile Review, the shingles lap at the sides, are closely interlocked, and one rivet suffices for a pair of shingles. It takes but fifteen of these shingles, 8 by 12 inches, to cover a square of 100 square feet, the waste is so small; whereas of slates of the same size 300 are required.
