TRUE CHRISTIAN OBEDIENCE

Today, as never before, Jesus is the world's hope. His personality towers above all other figures on the world's horizon, and men, in greater numbers than ever, acknowledge that the exertion of His power on our behalf is the one supreme necessity. So we take the key-note of our Christmas rejoicing the title given by prophecy: "Immanuel," meaning, "God with us."

Caution is needed in our use of the name and in our claim to the assurance that it brings. The late German Kaiser brought on himself the ridicule of the world by his application to his cause of the sacred word: "God with us." He was hurling his forces against nations who wanted only to be left alone, aiming at their subjection to his will, and he assumed a blasphemous title on the side of God, "robbery with violence."

The birth of Jesus meant the entry of a divine factor into the human conflict. He came to be the leader of God's people, and, as Leader, endowed with the power of God, Jesus is Lord of events. When men refuse to bow to His authority, He overrules their opposition to serve God's ends.

Since Christ is Lord, He requires obedience first of all. He asks, as of old, "Why do you call me Lord and not do what I tell you?" His commands include the moral law of the Old Testament and far more. He said: "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

How is obedience possible for sinful men? The very first announcement in the New Testament, carried the answer. The angel said to Joseph: "You shall call His name Jesus, for He will save His people from their sins."

RETURNS FROM HEALTH ACTIVITIES IN INDIA A wide range of experience is being brought to her job here by Miss Kathleen M. Jackson, M.B.E., who has recently returned from India to again take over the task of physiotherapy in connection with both the Red Cross and the Polyclinic. Miss Jackson originally trained at the Shropshire Orthopaedic Hospital, in England, and also took a course in medical electricity in London. While in Shropshire she took specialized training in orthopaedic nursing, after-care supervision, plaster technique and allied subjects. Her post-graduate training included courses in poliomyelitis, cerebral palsy, chest surgery, physiotherapy and medical rehabilitation. A wartime experience has stood her in good stead as it has included the job of being plaster technician in various hospitals treating air-raid victims. In addition, she was head physiotherapist at the Rehabilitation Centre for Indian Troops at Lucknow, India, from 1944 to 1946. For this work she was awarded the M.B.E. Since the end of the war Miss Jackson has served in Germany as the head physiotherapist in the British Red Cross Medical Rehabilitation School for German and D. P. war injured persons. Her work included both the organization and administration of the Centre at Bad Pyrmont, the teaching of post-graduate students and lecture tours through the three west zones of Germany. She came here in 1950 and immediately took over the task of looking after the Provincial Sanatorium and those of crippled children at the Red Cross. Last June she returned to India for a short term appointment in Bombay to conduct a post-graduate course for Indian physiotherapists so that they might organize physiotherapy departments in the many hospitals in that city. Miss Jackson has now resumed her work at the Red Cross and the Polyclinic since her return from India last month.
