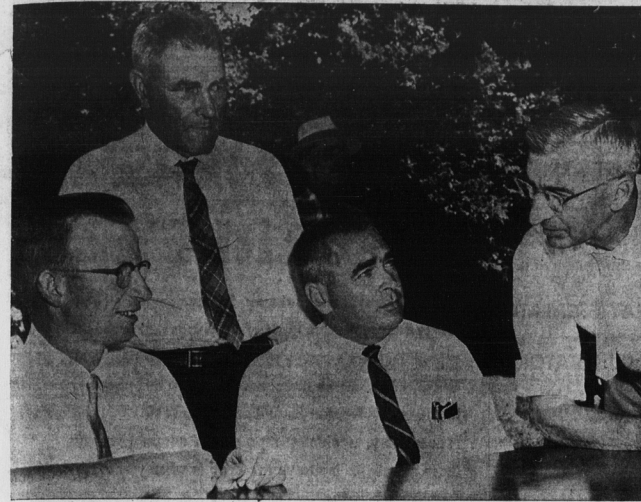

N.S. MILK TRUCKED HERE

More Dairy Production Is Urged For Province

Large tank trucks are bringing milk here from Nova Scotia to supply the demand at Central Creameries for their Perfection milk products. Agriculture Minister MacRae told Dairy breeders yesterday he called for more dairy production here to meet the demand in the Maritime area that does not supply one-half of its requirements.

The Island production has fallen off drastically, this year, the minister contrasted, and did not believe that the poor hay from last summer was responsible for all of it.

An official ROP list made available by Mr. Paron shows that 37.6 per cent of the 93 herds on test here—that includes all

breeds—to be 10 cows or less, 31.2 per cent to be 11 to 15 cows, 14 per cent of the herds 16 to 20 milk cows, 7.5 per cent had herds of 21-25 cows and 9.6 per cent of the herds had 26 to 30 animals. There are no herds with more cattle on test.

By contrast Nova Scotia had 6.4 per cent of its herds running from 20-25 cows on test and New Brunswick had 3.2 per cent.
