**Says Foreign Investors Are Being Scared**

KENORA, Ont. (CP)—Former Liberal finance minister Walter Harris says some foreign investors have stopped spending money in Canada because they are uncertain of the Progressive Conservative trade policy.

He told an election meeting Saturday night Canada's trade balance with overseas countries has been down since last June when the Conservatives took over the government.

Speaking on behalf of his former parliamentary assistant, William M. Bendickson, Liberal candidate in the Kenora-Rainy River riding, he said:

"Do Canadians care where they sell their products? Of course they want to do business with Britain. But does that mean they have to cut trade with the United States?"

He was referring a Conservative proposal to divert 15 per cent of Canada's trade with the United States to the United Kingdom.

**SHOTS FOR TOTS Have Emotional Monitor Value**

"A child's response to having a shot is a good clue to his emotional maturity," according to a release from the American Medical Association received by the Health League of Canada.

A study of 113 children ranging from tiny babies to 12-year-olds, showed changing responses as they grew older, Dr. Karl E. Kasowitz stated.

He said that many shots and vaccinations that children must routinely undergo offer an excellent means for studying their psychology and measuring their maturity.

**TOUGHNESS**

All children must learn self-control and develop pride in their "toughness," he said. Their reactions to shots show how well they have developed these traits.

During the first six months of life, children had no emotional response to being shot. From the end of the first year through the fourth year, there is the greatest amount of "more or less violent fear and resentment."
