



TEMPERATURE OUTLOOK

United States long-range forecasts predict that Canada, from Quebec-Ontario border westward, will enjoy temperatures above normal seasonal readings during the next 30 days. This map, based on the U.S. weather bureau temperature outlook for April, shows that eastern Quebec and the Atlantic Provinces can expect near-normal temperatures. Near-normal readings are expected in a band running northward between the eastern end of Lake Superior and the mouth of the St. Lawrence River.
