

Heritiera Is Favored in Cambridgehire Handicap

NEWMARKET, England (AP)—Top bookmakers have shortened the betting odds on Heritiera to 1 1/2 for today's Cambridgehire Handicap, while American-owned Fairy Stone and the 1950 winner, Loppings, have become joint second choices at 10 to 1.

Heritiera dropped from 9 to 1 at Monday's 4:30 P.M. Fairy Stone remained at 10 to 1 and Loppings shifted from 100 to 1 to 15 to 1 for today's Cambridgehire Handicap, while American-owned Fairy Stone and the 1950 winner, Loppings, have become joint second choices at 10 to 1.

Heritiera and Fairy Stone, both three-year-old fillies, are among the best-backed entries in the probable field of 38 starters for the 1 1/4-mile race. Heritiera is a bay filly by Rocketella out of Star of France.

She gained a lot of support after changing owners. Her price was shortened from 90 to 1 a fortnight ago.

Archibald's son of England bought Heritiera originally as a doubtful starter, a few days ago he would be a trained odds runner for \$25,000. The filly started impressively. When Kotton said she would be a starter the odds dropped sharply.

Average Wage Is Up 5 Cents

OTTAWA (CP)—Average weekly wages in the manufacturing sector in Canada rose a record \$68.33 in August, up five cents from \$67.65 in July, according to a survey of 125 factories by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics.

The August figure represented an increase of 8 1/2 per cent, compared with the corresponding month a year ago.

The bureau's industrial employment index, based on 1949 equaling 100, rose in August for a fourth consecutive month to a record 127.4. This compared with 126.6 at July 1 and 123.4 at the beginning of August a year ago.

Canadian Art Brings High Bid

LONDON (CP)—A painting by the 19th-century Canadian artist, Cornelius Krieghoff, was sold for a record price Wednesday at the Daily Telegraph's comments that the sale "provided further evidence of the phenomenal popularity of this mediocre artist."

"His only claim to fame is that he painted the first Canadian painter working in Canada at the middle of the last century."

The painting, "The Trapper's Return," was sold at Sotheby's for £2,800, or \$3,800, by G. Cole, a Canadian collector. Cole also bought a second Krieghoff, a view of the St. Lawrence River, for 900.

Fill 17-Week German Posts

BONN (Reuters)—Fritz Schaefer, often criticized for having lost a strip of pipe from a nuclear power station, was removed Monday from his post as finance minister by Chancellor Konrad Adenauer's cabinet.

The move became official when President Theodor Heuss announced the list of 17 men who were sworn in as cabinet ministers Tuesday. The new cabinet begins his third term as chancellor.

Schaefer will become minister of justice in the new cabinet and will be replaced as finance minister by Franz Ehard, vice-chancellor of the Grand coalition.

U. S. To Ease Tight Money

NEW YORK (AP)—The New York Times says in a Washington story that the federal reserve system has decided to ease its tight money policy.

There was no immediate comment from the reserve bank.

The decision does not involve any change in the basic policy of restraint, it adds.

"But it is a significant switch toward less pressure on the nation's banking system. It could mean some lowering in short-term interest rates and some easing in the availability of credit."

The paper quotes what it called authoritative but unnamed sources as reporting the board made its decision because of a downturn by some factors although it believes the general business picture is still strong.

Study Message From Italians In Soviet Prison

PALERMO, Sicily (Reuters)—A bird that carried a message from Italy to the Soviet Union in Russia may in fact have come from the Soviet Union.

The Italian biologist at the Zoological Institute of Palermo University was asked to examine the bird to help solve the mystery.

He reported Saturday the bird is a common aquatic bird (gallinula chloropus) which spends the summer in Northern Europe and files north to the Soviet Union in the fall.

The bird, shot by Sicilian hunters three days before it was sent to Moscow, carries a message in a leg container.

"We are 300 Italian soldiers who have been prisoners of war in Russia for 13 years. We are working like slaves in mines in the North. Do come soon from Italy, Verona, Padova and Rovigo provinces. Do anything you can."

Marzio Bernadetti, a member of parliament and president of the Italian National Association of the Families of War Dead and Missing, has asked the government to hold an inquiry.

About 83,000 Italians still are listed officially as "missing in Russia." The Soviet government denies any Italian prisoners are still alive in Russia.
