I do not like walking alone at night on campus because I am barely aware of my surroundings in the dark. There are shadows everywhere, which creates a sense of eeriness.

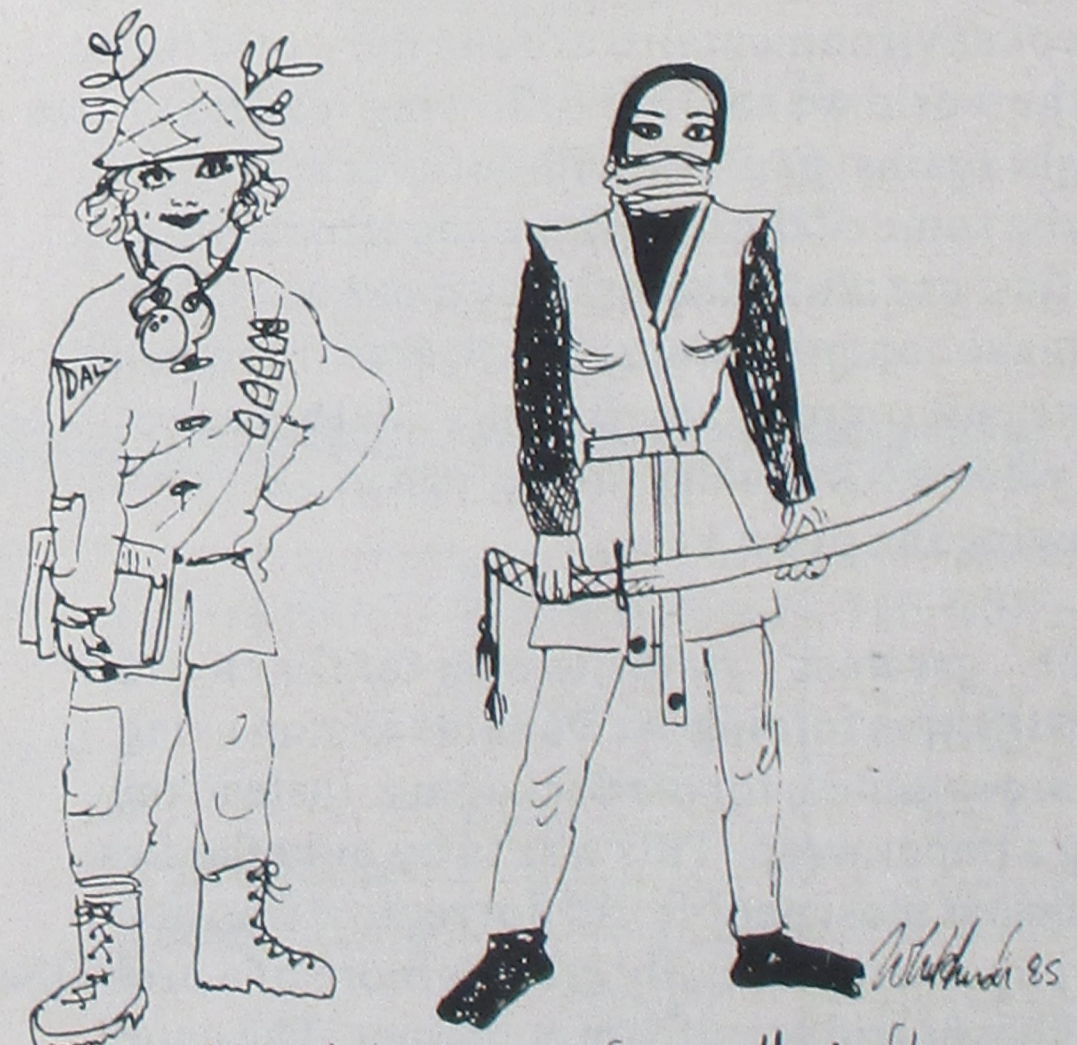
