Flan (Caramel) Upside-Down Custard

Coffee
Tea
Milk
Note: Potatoes goufrette are thin-sliced honey-comb or lattice-style potatoes, deep-fried; they may be purchased frozen.

Measurements are level; recipes for 8 adapted from The Spanish Cuisine.

LAMB STEAKS OR CHOPS SEVILLE
2½ pounds lamb steaks or chops cut ¼ inch thick
1-3 teaspoon garlic salt
2 tablespoons olive oil
1¼ teaspoons salt
¼ teaspoon pepper

Rub steaks or chops with garlic salt; brush with oil. Dust with salt and pepper. Broil 3 minutes 3 inches from source of heat, turning when well browned. When done, meat should be deep pink inside.

Grind fresh black pepper over meat. Pass bottled meat sauce of choice. Accompaniment: thin-sliced fresh celery or cucumber marinated in lemon mint dressing. Garnish with cress.

FLAN (CARAMEL UPSIDE-DOWN CUSTARD)
Line 8 (4 oz.) custard cups with hot caramelized granulated sugar. Fill the cups with standard baked custard mixture often given in this column. Bake as usual.

When cooled and unmolded, custards will be topped and surrounded with the resulting caramel sauce.

To prepare the caramel: Melt ¼ cup granulated sugar until lightly browned. At once pour ¼ tablespoons into each custard cup and rotate to form a thin lining.

THE CHEF'S LEMON MINT DRESSING
Very nice with thin-sliced cucumber, celery or beets.

Combine 3 tablespoons lemon juice, 6 tablespoons olive oil, ¼ teaspoon salt, 1-1½ teaspoon white pepper and 3 tablespoons chopped fresh mint. Mix a 4 pour over the sliced vegetable.

Cover. Marinate (let stand 1 to season) 2 hours or more, in a cool place.
