Sabateur, 2-year-old trotter, \$61,947.87. Hillside, aged pacer, \$61,273.33. Scott Frost with Joe O'Brien holding the reins went to the post 27 times, registered 22 wins, 2 seconds and one third. He didn't lose a race to 3-year-olds, annexing both the \$86,000 Hambletonian and the \$62,000 Kentucky Futurity, and wound up the season by heading aged stars in the \$75,000 American Trotting Classic at Hollywood Park.
