### Misunderstanding Is Said Reason For Lack Of Counsel

Making reference to the case of James Robert Doucette, Charlottetown, charged with non-support on complaint of his wife, Florence Doucette, Crown Prosecutor Alan Scates said in city police court yesterday it was "through no fault of the crown that no counsel was provided for the informant."

Mr. Scates said the matter had been merely a misunderstanding. Mrs. Doucette, in her testimony yesterday, said she had married the accused in 1959, and since that time he had failed to provide for her or their two children. She said he had been off the island most of the time since their marriage. The accused was remanded to Dec. 20, with bail to stand.

**EXPLAINS DETAILS**  
Mr. Scates explained that Mrs. Doucette had gone to Deputy Attorney-General J.A. McGuigan and laid information against the accused, but at this time the accused was out of the province. When the accused had returned, Mrs. Doucette was unable to contact Mr. McGuigan then in Summerside, so she asked Mr. Nicholson to represent her.

## Search Fails To Locate Pair

STEPHENVILLE, Nfld. (CP) — A United States Air Force helicopter and a search party led by the RCMP combed the west coast shoreline around St. George's Bay Tuesday for two Newfoundland hunters who have been missing in an open 12-foot dory since Saturday.

The two, Peter Hynes, 18, of Port au Port and Emile Jesso, 24, of March Point, left March Point during a hull in a vicious wind and snow storm Saturday to hunt birds. While they were gone, the wind switched directions and the storm worsened. Jesso's mother saw them trying to row ashore against the wind but they didn't make it.

Although almost all hope was gone that they would be found alive, searchers began scouring the shoreline Tuesday in the chance that they may have come ashore in an isolated area. The helicopter from the Harmond U.S. Air Force Base here was taking part and an RCMP plane has been in the search since Sunday.
