New York Stocks

NEW YORK. (AP) - Bearishness is spreading in Wall Street. Cautious stock warnings are being hoisted by some.

The cause is the fall by the stock market for the year. Most of the market's gains in the post-election boom have evaporated.

But there is a strong undercurrent of optimism in Wall Street based on the inherent strength of the U. S. economy.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks declined last week to a new low for the year. The fall has been going on for the last five weeks.

There were renewed indications that U. S. defence spending was being narrowed down, and in Wall Street there was an effort to readjust trading and investment thinking to encompass that development.

Canadian stocks were mixed. Canadian Pacific and Dome Mines both slipped 1-8. McIntyre lost 1-2. International Nickel gained 1-8 and Distillers Seagram added 1-2.

On the American stock exchange Canadian issues were lower. Giant Yellowknife and Royaltite Oil each fell 1-8.

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND. (AP) - Steel magazine discussing possible increases in the price of steel, predicted today that demand by consumers for the metal would be a big factor.

"An apparently insatiable demand of today can be sluggish less than a year hence," curbing efforts to boost prices, the metal-working journal held.

After noting that industry leaders have been "building up a case for a general increase," the magazine pointed out the drop in prices of nonferrous metals, for which the demand has decreased.

In April 1952, the magazine recalled, lead averaged 18.72 cents per pound, zinc 19.5 cents and tin 121.5 cents. Last week the price for lead was 11.8 cents, for zinc 11 cents and for tin 95 cents, the magazine continued.

"Steel" also asserted that "immediate deterrents" to a general steel price boost "are the public and government reaction to a general increase so soon after restoration of price freedom and the inflationary effect it would have on the approaching wage negotiations with the steelworkers' union."

Production increased last week. The magazine's figures showed the industry was turning out steel for ingots and castings at 99.5 per cent of U.S. rated capacity, a jump of 2.5 points.

THE EUCALYPTUS One of the newest assets of central and southern Brazil is the widespread planting of eucalyptus trees, imported not so long ago from Australia. As sometimes happens with plants imported to another country, the eucalyptus grows fast and bigger in Brazil than in its native soil. It is at present largely used for firewood, and as fuel for the up country railroads. However, new ways of making the wood into paper pulp may create a whole new Brazilian industry. The eucalyptus can be cut every five years, and three cuttings may be made before replanting becomes necessary.
